Finally, the name given to the contemporary art strand of McMahon's place of practice: deAppendix, correlates two-fold with O' Dea's material choices influenced by her background in medicine: appendix as (1) a human anatomical feature with no known biological function, and (2) a thing attached to the end of something else.

Tactile processes like photographs, montage, printmaking and paper making are amongst these methods. As too, is the layered approach and mark making example found in the drawings. Marie-Claire has said in relation to spending the next eight weeks at The Appendix: This work has been influenced by the light and texture of seascapes off the west of Ireland. The sense of wilderness of the landscape and the contrasts of the delicacy of light against the solid structure of the coastline are what attracted me to this theme. The work was explored further at a recent artist residency at Inislacken Island, Roundstone in June Installed, this work is reminiscent of a stained glass window. When the evening light catches it the whole panel lights up the room. Amongst other cultures, including the Aztecs, the Greeks prized these plants for their great healing and nutritional qualities. Utilising symbols and text, applied with glass paints on clear acrylic sheeting, the panel tells the story of this wondrous plant, whilst also casting rich colours into the room during daylight hours. At night, a different treatment with mark-making on the reverse surface of the panel creates an intriguing effect which plays with both the interior light in the room and the streetlights outside. The piece is thus transformed from a series of images that engage the curiosity of the viewer into a surface that demands the physical interaction of the viewer in order to be fully appreciated. We are delighted to announce that for the months of November and December our inaugural Artist-In-Residence, Marie Soffe, will be based in a designated studio in deAppendix. Following the residency Marie will exhibit the work influenced by her time at Amaranta Family Practice in the surgery itself. And, as a taster of what is to come, some of her previous work can now be seen in the practice reception and waiting room. The work on show is part of a larger body of work that Marie made following a scholarship in Poland and the image below is a detail from one of her drypoint prints: Marie says about her residency: However, the basis of both medicine and art is enquiry – in order to bring out into the open whatever ails the patient or intrigues the artist. The Amaranta Family Practice looks out over a large, wooded green, an expansive space with the southern sky as a constantly changing backdrop. This, in itself, is a healing and calming sight that most likely goes unnoticed in this long-settled residential area. Some collectors focus on media, such as oil paintings on canvas, or watercolors. Some of the oldest known paintings can be found at the Chauvet Cave in France, which are estimated to be about 32,000 years old. During the late Renaissance, oil painting techniques were developed in the Netherlands, which quickly spread across Europe. Oil paint is a more flexible medium, and allows for a greater range of optical effects; this in turn led to new expressive techniques for artists. Tempera paint was the preferred medium of choice in Renaissance Italy. It has been used since antiquity, and examples from the first century AD still exist today. During the Era of Enlightenment, five genres of paintings were advocated by art academies, including the French Academy and the Royal Academy in London. The genres were organized into a hierarchy, and include history painting, portraits, landscapes, still lifes, and genre painting. The invention of photography in the 19th century greatly affected the course of painting. The art movements of the late 19th century and early 20th century, including Impressionism, Fauvism, Expressionism, and Cubism, were steps away from previous art movements that were rooted in realism and capturing the surrounding world with paint. The Baroque movement of the 17th century included Rembrandt, Caravaggio, and Rubens, which was followed by the Rococo movement Boucher and Fragonard, and the French neo-classical movement David and Ingres. Romanticism, which is encapsulated by the works of Goya, Delacroix, Turner, and Constable, was followed by Realism, of which the French artists Courbet and Manet are most recalled today. Pablo Picasso is perhaps the most noted artist of the 20th century. Paint is a liquid mixture of pigment and a binding agent such as oil or water. A painting is created on a two-dimensional surface ground; a wall painting or fresco is also considered to be a painting. Oil, acrylic, and watercolor are some of the most common types of paint used today. Before oil became the predominant paint of choice by European painters around the turn of the 16th century, tempera was the reigning medium. Tempera is an extremely colorfast paint, evidenced by the many centuries-old, yet still vibrant, tempera paintings which survive today. As tempera is quick to dry, it is usually applied in thin layers until the desired color saturation is achieved. In contrast, oil paint dries very slowly, so artists are able to apply the paint in thick layers as well as easily blend colors together. The oils used for painting are derived from linseed, walnut and poppy. Watercolor can be created by mixing pigment with water, and is usually applied to paper. Before the 19th century, watercolor was used primarily for sketches, but with artists such as J. Turner, it slowly grew to be respected as a medium. Acrylic paint, which was invented in the 20th century, is synthetic and water-soluble, and when it dries looks very similar to oil paint. Acrylic paint is perhaps the most popular type of paint with modern and contemporary artists. In order to create a painting, an artist will apply paint with a brush, or other tool such as a palette knife, to a surface such as a canvas, wood panel, paper, wall, glass, copper, or concrete.

At the same time, possibility is also a feature of De Appendix itself. The doctor in question is Dr. As a practising artist herself, she provides her patients with a unique experience while they wait to be seen. These transitional non-spaces are now positioned as non-art spaces that contain art. Dublin, along with the selfsame addressed Amaranta Family Practice, not only share identical google coordinates but also the same scope of possibility when interpreting our human connection to that which binds us. The work currently showing at deAppendix explores the fragility of our human existence as that which binds us to life. The artists selected by McMahon tend to fall in line with the possibility of art as cathartic for her non-art audience. Aristotle used the term as metaphor in De Poetica c. Possibility , draws us in to its non-spin and awaits for the catalytic hand to assist in its turning. The viewer as catalyst sets something in motion; Possibility stands alone, spinning, and at the same time, goes nowhere. This work draws our attention to the notion of time as non-linear; but there is something amiss with regards the circular action, perhaps it has to do with the incorporation of the drain? This work does not run smooth; it is disembodied from its objective function, and because of this, the body belonging to the catalytic hand acts as a replacement for the absent body bound by such a thing as a wheelchair. It is in this exchange between body and absent body that the cathartic nature of this work takes hold. The inclusion of a drain in Possibility is a re-constellation of those emotions felt, that of fear, vulnerability, helplessness, invisibility and waste. Possibility has been placed on the threshold of the Amaranta Family Practice. Located in the entrance hall, this stainless steel sculpture awaits its turn, where as, ordinarily, a patient would just pass on through such a space into the waiting room next door.
