Many regard it as the primary theme in Scripture with the glory of God as its goal. The use of the title of pharaoh was often situational: Other than his temple at Alexandria, Serapis had another centre in Memphis, where, on the necropolis of Sakkara, the Serapeum became one of the most famous sites in the country. Isis became the companion of Serapis, who also inherited many of the attributes of Osiris, including mastery over the underworld. The mystic rites of Isis, to which women as well as men were admitted after an initiation ceremony, was based mainly on the explicit promise of immortality that they offered to adherents. The API's bull was believed to enjoy eternal life in the sense that he was reborn as soon as he died. When they died, API's bulls were buried in the subterranean galleries of the Serapeum, which was discovered by Mariette, the French archaeologist, in the middle of last century. Found there were 24 granite and basalt API's sarcophagi the heaviest of which weighed almost 70 tons. The Serapeum was served by voluntary monks and included a sanatorium where the sick came in the hope of receiving miraculous cures. The cult of Serapis was to have sweeping success throughout Greece and Asia Minor, especially in Rome, where it became the most popular religion. There was a Serapis temple in Rome as early as 300 BC. Initiation into the Serapis cult included the rite of baptism, and Sir Alan Gardiner, the British Egyptologist, argued in the *Journal of Egyptian Archaeology* in 1927 that Egyptian baptism should be seen as analogous to Christian baptism, of which he commented: Serapis and Christ existed side-by-side and were frequently seen as interchangeable. Some early Christians made no distinction between Christ and Serapis and frequently worshipped both, while paintings of Isis with her son Horus became identified by early Christians as portraits of Mary with her son Jesus. The rite of baptism, part of the initiation ceremony of the Serapis cult, was also adopted by the Church as part of its initiation ceremony. In AD 117, after a visit to Alexandria, the Emperor Hadrian wrote a letter to his elderly brother-in-law, Servianus, in which he commented: I know the land from top to bottom. In it the worshippers of Serapis are Christians, and those who call themselves Bishops of Christ pay their vows to Serapis. Whenever the patriarch himself comes to Egypt he is made to worship Serapis by some and Christ by others. We also send you the good news of the settlement concerning the holy pasch, namely that in answer to your prayers this question also has been resolved. All the brethren in the East who have hitherto followed the Jewish practice will henceforth observe the custom of the Romans and of yourselves and of all of us who from ancient times have kept Easter together with you. Through it a precedent was set for subsequent general councils to adopt creeds and canons. The agenda of the synod included: The disputed issues centered on the natures and relationship of God the Father and the Son of God Jesus. Alexander maintained that the Son was divine in just the same sense that the Father is, coeternal with the Father, else he could not be a true Son. The Arian discussions and debates at the council extended from about May 20, 318, through about June 19, 318. This account is almost certainly apocryphal, as Arius himself would not have been present in the council chamber due to the fact that he was not a bishop. Much of the debate hinged on the difference between being "born" or "created" and being "begotten". Arians saw these as essentially the same; followers of Alexander did not. The exact meaning of many of the words used in the debates at Nicaea were still unclear to speakers of other languages. The position being that the Son had a beginning, and that only the Father has no beginning. And Arius argued that everything else was created through the Son. Thus, said the Arians, only the Son was directly created and begotten of God; and therefore there was a time that He had no existence. The Arians appealed to Scripture, quoting biblical statements such as "the Father is greater than I", and also that the Son is "firstborn of all creation". The opposing view stemmed from the idea that begetting the Son is itself in the nature of the Father,

which is eternal. Thus, the Father was always a Father, and both Father and Son existed always together, eternally, coequally and consubstantially. The contra-Arian argument thus stated that the Logos was "eternally begotten", therefore with no beginning. They insisted that such a view was in contravention of such Scriptures as "I and the Father are one" and "the Word was God", as such verses were interpreted. They declared, as did Athanasius, that the Son had no beginning, but had an "eternal derivation" from the Father, and therefore was coeternal with him, and equal to God in all aspects. Councils of the third century: These decisions were confirmed by a synod in Rome in the autumn of the same year. Felicissimus and his followers attempted to have their case re-opened in the following year, but their demands were rejected. Either sleep a little longer each night before your late night or grab an afternoon nap that day. People who stay busy while they are sleepy tend to rally, pushing sleepiness aside because they are interested in the new task. Use caffeine the right way. Caffeine is an effective aide for staying up late. However, just chugging one big caffeinated beverage at the start of the shift will not help you through the whole evening. Taking a short half-hour nap during a shift can be effective, but some people will feel sluggish afterward. Drink an 8-ounce cup of coffee, which is about 75 milligrams of caffeine, before your nap. Stay in bright light. Prepare for 4 a. Banking sleep will get you only so far through the night, however. Adjusting Your Schedule Switching to a regular night shift schedule takes more effort. Sleeping during the day is fundamentally different from night sleep. Keeping that in mind, people who need to work night shifts should try these strategies: Establish a fake day-night cycle. A study in the Journal of Clinical Sleep Medicine found that night shift nurses were best able to adjust to the schedule if they exposed themselves to extremely bright light during the beginning of their shift and then wore dark glasses after the shift. Many people make the mistake of trying to replicate night sleep during the day. Get up and do what you need to do. After three or four hours of wakefulness, take another three- or four-hour nap before going back to work. Alcohol may help you fall asleep, but it can cause disturbances that ruin the quality of your sleep.
