For all his adult years, Taylor has sought out women who need to be rescued, women he leaves as soon as their crisis is over and the relationship starts to become truly intimate. The young mom is with her four-year-old son Kyle, a boy with severe learning disabilities and for whom she has sacrificed everything. Taylor McAden finds her unconscious and bleeding, but does not find Kyle. Years ago, when he was five and a half, my oldest son Miles had to have his tonsils taken out, so we brought him to the doctor the day before surgery, so the doctor could tell him what was going to happen. The doctor then asked if he could see Ryan in the office for a few minutes. A few minutes later, the doctor returned with Ryan, a serious expression on his face. Do you want to know what my first thought was as I stared first at the doctor, then my wife, and then at my son? The movie with Dustin Hoffman, where he plays an autistic character. The one where he lives in an institution. Was that, I wondered, going to be the future for my son? It took six weeks for the evaluation to take place. Six weeks of worry, six weeks of stress, six weeks of absolute fear. Getting the results added another couple of weeks, and when they were done, we sat in the office with another doctor. Then two more weeks to get those results. We were wrong with our first evaluation. But we do recommend getting another test, this time on his hearing, so we can be sure nothing is physically wrong with him. And it took another six weeks before the doctor sat us down again. And two months later, we sat down again. The town is built on the waterfront, and what once served as a port of call now welcomes locals and visitors alike for pleasure boaters and water sports. Off the beaten path, travelers will find quiet bed and breakfasts and wide countryside which was once home to rich plantations. On and on, evaluation after evaluation, without answers, without a plan of action, without knowing what was wrong with our son or whether it was going to be okay. This was all happening in , and was a pretty eventful year for me. Needless to say, there was a lot going on that year. When The Notebook was published, I went on a tour that lasted a little longer than three months and my wife was home alone with our two children, so for Christmas that year, I bought my wife a gift I thought she would love. I got her a trip to Hawaii without me. Though it pains me to say this now, our marriage was a little rocky that year. While she was in Hawaii, we had an argument about the state of our relationship and my wife called me to the carpet. I wake up every morning and worry about Ryan. I wonder if Ryan will ever have a friend. Or go to school. Or drive a car, or have a girlfriend, or go to the prom. I wonder if Ryan will have to live with us forever. Needless to say, I apologized to my wife and then I said: I promise to cure our son. During that time, I came up with a plan that I thought might just work. The next day, I bought a small table and chair the chair had a seatbelt and I strapped my son into the chair. I opened a picture book, held out a small piece of candy, and pointed to the first word and image. At ten minutes, he was screaming in fury, a temper tantrum times ten. It was the first time in a year that I knew my son could learn. Such a small thing, but until that point, neither my wife nor I knew whether he was capable of that. And then, for the first time in what seemed like forever, there was a light at the end of the tunnel. A tiny light, but a light nonetheless. The next day, I strapped him in and worked with him for another six hours. That night, I called my wife in Hawaii and apologized again. I put my older son on the phone and he

talked to his mom, then I got on the phone again. My wife and I had to work with Ryan extensively hours daily to teach him to talk. He also gets straight As. How much research did you do with regard to firefighting? Enough to write about it as accurately as possible. After reading your novel, I realized that I know a child like Kyle. What can you recommend that I do? Where can I find information? Denise worked with Kyle in exactly the way that my wife and I worked with our son. I can only tell you that our son is fine nowâ€”but his recovery required a great deal of time and effort hours per day of home therapy. If the child you know is diagnosed with CAPD, further information can be found on the Internet and in most comprehensive child development books; I would recommend reading as much as you can about the disorder. Are the two books that Denise mentions in the novel real books? Although my own methods and routines departed significantly from those discussed in the above-mentioned titlesâ€”every child is differentâ€”I recommend them both. Why did Mitch have to die? Taylor needed something to push him into finally accepting the truth about himself. Have film rights to The Rescue been sold? Not at this time. Grimble is murdered the night Soren and Gylfie escape by St. After escaping, they then meet Twilight , an orphan great grey owl who learned his survival instincts from the "Orphan School of Tough Learning", Digger , a burrowing owl , who lost his family to the St. Soon after the band arrives at the tree, they begin their training as guardians and soon are proficient in their selected chaws, or classes, They also meet other owls, such as Otulissa , a spotted owl , Primrose , a northern pygmy owl , Martin, a northern saw-whet owl , and learn many secrets such as colliering, navigation, search and rescue and weather navigation. Ezylyrb the old whiskered screech owl , the weather chaw ryb or teacher , becomes good friends with Soren. After a long period of time passes, hundreds of owlets are found abandoned in the middle of an uninhabited forest. Stranger it turns out, that all of them are "babbling of the purity of Tyto ". When she and the others regain full consciousness, they have no memory of what had happened, where they were from and why they were in the literal middle of nowhere. After a long while, the band goes to investigate the disappearance and seeks information of what could have happened. Then, during the time of copper-rose rain Autumn at the Great Tree , the band sneaks away during a week-long festival to go talk to the Rogue Smith in hopes they will not be noticed missing. When speaking with the Smith, they discover that the famous singer at the Great Tree, Madame Plonk, is related to the Smith and that there is a group of terrible owls known as The Pure Ones is led by Metal Beak. Soon later, Eglantine begins remembering where she was at the time she was missing and tells the band that she remembers being in a castle during the imprisonment. The chaw picks up branches and sets them alight so that the can fight with fire and part way through the battle, Martin, and Ruby , a short-eared owl. Ezylyrb and the Chaw of Chaws fly home and are met with cheering, and as daylight sets in, Ezylyrb writes a poem of the impending war with the Pure Ones. After Simon nurses Kludd back to health, Kludd murders Simon and flies up to a branch with another local owl on it. However, the other owl is a spotted owl named Mist and is practically invisible. Otulissa declares "Sprink on your Spronk" and causes Dewlap to faint on the spot. Soon after, The Chaw of Chaws is contracted to the task of infiltrating the St. Aegolious Academy for Orphaned Owls on the speculation that the Pure Ones have infiltrated the academy for its large supply of flecks, and in the same meeting, Ezylyrb gives Otulissa Fleckasia and Other Disorders of the Gizzard. Otulissa goes with the punishment but eventually flies away to join the Chaw and as a result, Dewlap, "out of futile desperation", flings the book into the sea. Not long after their arrival, they discover barn owls sneaking flecks out of the library, where all of the flecks at St. During the commotion, Soren struck in the rear, damaging his rudder feathers and on the way back to the Great Tree, he became gravely ill. As Soren nears death, a local spotted owl named Hortense yet it is male went to the home of Mist and told them of Soren and she brought a flying snake named Slynella who had venom that could heal illness. After Soren regains his health, Mist reveals that she is the original Hortense and that the Pure Ones were planning to attack the Great Tree. Eglantine eventually decides that her dreams of her parents are true, flying out from the Great Tree to meet up with her parents in the Beaks.
