The summer programs required money to send each student to Y camp for a week, pay students for reading books one summer, and to pay for art classes at the local community college. Fred gives the students a full spectrum of learning to include the real world. Everyone is responsible for his own future no matter what obstacles cross his path. My husband and I support the program financially now and have helped a CAP graduate enrolled in pre-med at a local college. Fred used all volunteer teachers until they were burned out and then was able to get grants to hire one or two. He needs to hire many more. CAP's shortcomings are lack of facility to accept all students on the waiting list and lack of funds to hire certified teachers to do the tutoring and teaching in this after school program. I saw for myself how every dollar was appreciated and used wisely to better this generation of children to be productive and mature citizens. I admire and respect Fred Bailey completely. His Assistant Director is a marvelous asset also. She relates to the students, gives a stern but motherly influence, and keeps the fires burning under volunteers and donors to make sure CAP maintains its goals. Zeng reported a study based on the census in which they found sex ratios of just 65 or 70 boys per girls for births in families that already had two or more boys. According to the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences , there will be 24 million more men than women of marriageable age by In fact, "out adoption" was not uncommon in China even before birth planning. In the s, adoptions of daughters accounted for slightly above half of the so-called "missing girls," as out-adopted daughters often went unreported in censuses and survey and adoptive parents were not penalized for violating birth quotas [86] However, in , a central decree attempted to close off this loophole by raising penalties and levying those penalties on any household that had an "unauthorized" child, including those that had adopted children. The peak wave of abandonment occurred in the s, with a smaller wave after In an interview with National Public Radio on 30 October , Adam Pertman, [90] president and CEO of the National Center on Adoption and Permanency, indicated that "the infant girls of yesteryear have not been available, if you will, for five, seven years. According to a China Daily report, the number of twins born per year was estimated to have doubled. For thousands of years, girls have held a lower status in Chinese households. As a result of being an only child, women have increased opportunity to receive an education, and support to get better jobs. One of the side effects of the one-child policy is to have liberated women from heavy duties in terms of taking care of many children and the family in the past; instead women had a lot of spare time for themselves to pursue their career or hobbies. The other major "side effect" of the one child policy is that the traditional concepts of gender roles between men and women have weakened. Being one and the only "chance" the parents have, women are expected to compete with peer men for better educational resources or career opportunities. Especially in cities where one-child policy was much more regulated and enforced, expectations on women to succeed in life are no less than on men. First, the average Chinese household expends fewer resources, both in terms of time and money, on children, which gives many Chinese people more money with which to invest. Second, since Chinese adults can no longer rely on children to care for them in their old age, there is an impetus to save money for the future. If not for personal savings, pensions, or state welfare fail, most senior citizens would be left entirely dependent upon their very small family or neighbours for assistance. If, for any reason, the single child is unable to care for their older adult relatives, the oldest generations would face a lack of resources and necessities. No social studies have investigated the ratio of these so-called "over-indulged" children and to what extent they are indulged. With the first generation of children born under the policy which initially became a requirement for most couples with first children born starting in and extending into the s reaching adulthood, such worries were reduced. Being over-indulged, lacking self-discipline and having no adaptive capabilities are traits that are highly associated with Chinese singletons. One statement read, "It is not healthy for children to play only

with their parents and be spoiled by them: According to a scholar, "The one-child limit is too extreme. Many went to Hong Kong, which is exempt from the one-child policy. Likewise, a Hong Kong passport differs from China mainland passport by providing additional advantages. Recently though, the Hong Kong government has drastically reduced the quota of births set for non-local women in public hospitals. As a result, fees for delivering babies there have surged. As further admission cuts or a total ban on non-local births in Hong Kong are being considered, mainland agencies that arrange for expectant mothers to give birth overseas are predicting a surge in those going to North America. As of , the island was experiencing an upswing in Chinese births, since birth tourism there had become cheaper than to Hong Kong. This option is used by relatively affluent Chinese who often have secondary motives as well, wishing their children to be able to leave mainland China when they grow older or bring their parents to the US. Canada , compared to US, is less achievable as their government denies many visa requests. This clearly depicts a desire for women to birth a son if one has not yet been birthed. Paul Schultz of Yale University discussed the effect of the transformation to the market on Chinese fertility, arguing that the introduction of the contract responsibility system in agriculture during the early s weakened family planning controls during that period. By the late s, economic costs and incentives created by the contract system were already reducing the number of children farmers wanted. Improved data[ edit ] Over the past decades, the availability and quality of data on homelessness has improved considerably, due, in part, to initiatives by the United States government. Since , the US Department of Housing and Urban Development has issued an Annual Homeless Assessment Report, which revealed the number of individuals and families that were homeless, both sheltered and unsheltered. About two-thirds of those stayed in emergency shelters or used transitional housing programs, with the remaining living on the street in abandoned buildings or other areas not meant for human habitation. More than 40 percent of sheltered homeless people have a disability. At the same time, sizable segments of the sheltered homeless population are white, non-Hispanic 38 percent , children 20 percent , or part of multi-person households 33 percent. Approximately 68 percent of the 1. Most people had relatively short lengths of stay in emergency shelters: The next three causes identified by mayors, in rank order, were mental illness or the lack of needed services, substance abuse and lack of needed services, and low-paying jobs. The lowest ranking cause, cited by five mayors, was prisoner reentry. Other causes cited were unemployment, domestic violence, and poverty. Juxtaposition of homeless and well off is common on Broadway , New York City Efforts to assist homeless people[ edit ] The community of homeless people in the United States is aided by governmental and non-governmental organizations. Housing[ edit ] Homeless individuals report a lack of affordable housing as the number one reason for becoming homeless. Several proposed policy measures are designed to secure such funding, such as the National Housing Trust Fund, but these have not been signed into law. The two main types of housing programs provided for homeless people are transitional and permanent housing. Transitional housing programs assist homeless for a fixed amount of time or until they are able to obtain housing on their own and function successfully in the community, or whichever comes first. Housing First allows homeless men and women to be taken directly off the street into private community-based apartments, without requiring treatment first. This allows the homeless to return to some sense of normalcy, from which it is believed that they are better-poised to tackle their addictions or sicknesses. The relapse rate through these types of programs is lower than that of conventional homeless programs. It asks cities to come up with a plan to end chronic homelessness under the assumption that if homeless people are given independent housing immediately with some social and financial support, then there will be reduced needs for emergency homeless shelters. Although many medical, psychiatric, and counseling services exist to address these needs, it is commonly believed that without the support of reliable and stable housing such treatments remain ineffective. Furthermore, in the absence of a universal health-care plan, many of those in need cannot afford such services. Proposed legislation such as the Bringing America Home Act are intended to provide comprehensive treatment for many homeless mental and substance abuse patients. In the government decided to start sending funding to people that are homeless, but it was not until that shelters were built to accommodate and feed them. As it was shown though seventy percent required homeless people to attend a religious ceremony and spend only a couple of nights there. In the McKinney Act the problem with homelessness became known as a huge social problem. The Chronic Homelessness Initiative. Bush Administration established a national goal of ending chronic homelessness in ten years, by The idea of a year plan to end chronic homelessness began as a part of a year plan to end homelessness in general adopted by the National Alliance to End Homelessness NAEH in In , as a part of his FY budget, President Bush made "ending chronic homelessness in the next decade a top objective. The Administration has recently undertaken some collaborative efforts to reach its goal of ending chronic homelessness in 10 years. Section 8 is the core housing program that helps extremely low-income families accommodate the gap between their incomes below 30 percent of the median income for each community. The government assists homeless families by awarding grants and vouchers. Vouchers are available to the families who are most needy and they are used to pay for housing found in the private market. Currently there are policy changes in who receives vouchers and there will be a reduction in the number of vouchers granted to the population of people that are homeless. Public libraries[ edit ] Public libraries can and often do significantly assist with the issues presented by homelessness. In many communities, the library is the only facility that offers free computer and internet access, so this is where many people experiencing homelessness go to locate services for basic needs such as healthcare, education, and housing. Libraries computers are also necessary for building a resume, searching for open jobs in the area,

and completing job applications. It mentions that Leah Esguerra, who is a psychiatric social worker, has a usual routine which is done by making her rounds to different homeless patrons and greeting them to see if she could help them. She offers help in different forms that could range from linking patrons with services or providing them with mental health counseling. She also supervises a week vocational program that culminates in gainful employment in the library for the formerly homeless Knight. Since this service started, staff at the library stated that they have noticed a drop in inappropriate behavior. The addition of Social Workers in the library has multiple benefits as they can assist with issues such as education; emergency services food, clothing, housing, and crisis support ; employment; family matters; health improvement including health insurance ; immigration; and support groups for men, women, and teens. In , the merged University Library and Public Library made the choice to be proactive in reaching out. Collaborations with nonprofit organizations in the area culminated in computer classes being taught, as well as nutrition classes, family literacy programs, and book discussion groups. When it was understood that these needs are complex, additional customer service training was provided to all staff who were interested. Programs were tailored to meet these needs. Additional changes implemented included temporary computer passes and generous in-house reading space to counteract the policies in place that may prevent a homeless person from obtaining a library card. The staff hopes these bimonthly events between staff and homeless patrons will help them better serve the homeless people population in Dallas. Guests often include social service providers. Education of homeless youth is thought to be essential in breaking the cycle of poverty.

I had to walk over and explain that they wanted to buy something. She looked down and reverted to an over-the-top-talking-to-little-children-voice, took their money, and gave them what they were after. And just like that, the independence they had felt was taken away. She was just not aware of how a few little actions may come across to a child. It got me thinking about how many times similar things have happened. Oftentimes people will ask me questions instead of asking my children directly. Children also seem to be held to a higher standard than adults a lot of the time. Constant obedience, no bad moods, perfect manners, impeccable self control. So many little things, but they all add up. So many things that maybe I might have done in the past too. But, my view now has changed and they stand out to me like a sore thumb. No less deserving of respect and acknowledgement than adults. We want them to grow up to be independent, confident adults who know their own worth. So in everything we do, we should give them that feeling.

**Additional Resources** How big is the problem? From 1999 to 2008, there were an average of 3, fatal unintentional drownings non-boating related annually in the United States – about ten deaths per day. Children ages 1 to 4 have the highest drowning rates. In 2008, among children 1 to 4 years old who died from an unintentional injury, one-third died from drowning. Between 1999 and 2008, the fatal unintentional drowning rate for African Americans was significantly higher than that of whites across all ages. The disparity is most pronounced in swimming pools; African American children drown in swimming pools at rates 5 times those of whites. This disparity is greatest among those years where African Americans drown in swimming pools at rates 10 times those of whites. Available rates are based on population, not on participation. The main factors that affect drowning risk are lack of swimming ability, lack of barriers to prevent unsupervised water access, lack of close supervision while swimming, location, failure to wear life jackets, alcohol use, and seizure disorders.

**Lack of Swimming Ability:** Drowning can happen quickly and quietly anywhere there is water such as bathtubs, swimming pools, buckets, and even in the presence of lifeguards. People of different ages drown in different locations. For example, most children ages 1 to 4 drown in home swimming pools. In 2008, the U. Coast Guard received reports for 4, boating incidents; 3, boaters were reported injured, and died. For persons with seizure disorders, drowning is the most common cause of unintentional injury death, with the bathtub as the site of highest drowning risk. Taking part in formal swimming lessons reduces the risk of drowning among children aged 1 to 4 years. A CDC study<sup>7</sup> about self-reported swimming ability found that: Younger adults reported greater swimming ability than older adults. Self-reported ability increased with level of education. Among racial groups, African Americans reported the most limited swimming ability. Men of all ages, races, and educational levels consistently reported greater swimming ability than women. CPR performed by bystanders has been shown to save lives and improve outcomes in drowning victims. The more quickly CPR is started, the better the chance of improved outcomes. Potentially, half of all boating deaths might be prevented with the use of life jackets. Designate a responsible adult to watch young children while in the bath and all children swimming or playing in or around water. Because drowning occurs quickly and quietly, adults should not be involved in any other distracting activity such as reading, playing cards, talking on the phone, or mowing the lawn while supervising children, even if lifeguards are present. Use the Buddy System. Always swim with a buddy. Select swimming sites that have lifeguards when possible. If you or a family member has a seizure disorder, provide one-on-one supervision around water, including swimming pools. Consider taking showers rather than using a bath tub for bathing. Wear life jackets when boating. Formal swimming lessons can protect young children from drowning. However, even when children have had formal swimming lessons, constant, careful supervision when children are in the water, and barriers, such as pool fencing to prevent unsupervised access, are still important. Air-Filled or Foam Toys are not safety devices. These toys are not life jackets and are not designed to keep swimmers safe. Avoid drinking alcohol before or during swimming, boating, or water skiing. Do not drink alcohol while supervising children. Know how to prevent recreational water illnesses. For more information about illnesses from recreational water, see the More Information section below. Know the local weather conditions and forecast before swimming or boating. Strong winds and thunderstorms with lightning strikes are dangerous. If you have a swimming pool at home: Install a four-sided pool fence that completely separates the pool area from the house and yard. The fence should be at least 4 feet high. Use self-closing and self-latching gates that open outward with latches that are out of reach of children. Also, consider additional barriers such as automatic door locks and alarms to prevent access or alert you if someone enters the pool area. Clear the Pool and Deck of Toys. Remove floats, balls and other toys from the pool and surrounding area immediately after use so children are not tempted to enter the pool area unsupervised. If you are in and around natural water settings: Coast Guard approved life jackets. This is important regardless of the distance to be traveled, the size of the boat, or the swimming ability of boaters; life jackets can reduce risk for weaker

swimmers too. Know the meaning of and obey warnings represented by colored beach flags. These may vary from one beach to another. Watch for dangerous waves and signs of rip currents. Some examples are water that is discolored and choppy, foamy, or filled with debris and moving in a channel away from shore. If you are caught in a rip current, swim parallel to shore. Once free of the current, swim diagonally toward shore.

Adults whose primary sexual attraction is for mid-to-late teens are properly called ephhebophiles , but ephhebophilia is not considered abnormal by mental health professionals. The opposite of pedophilia is teleiophilia attraction to adults. Condition[ change change source ] Medically, this condition is classified by the American Psychiatric Association as a mental disorder. This is called " child sexual abuse " because by law, children are unable to truly agree to sexual acts with an adult. Some adults have pedophilic feelings but do not act by sexually abusing children. Some adults who are not pedophiles commit sexual abuse against children. Not all pedophiles feel or act in the same way. Since the s, psychologists have studied and shown that different pedophiles might act in different ways: They are called exclusive pedophiles. Some pedophiles have a sexual preference for prepubescent children but are sexually attracted to adults as well. They are called preferential pedophiles. Some adults who prefer adult sexual partners are also sexually attracted to prepubescent children. General[ change change source ] For pedophiles who commit child sexual abuse, some studies have shown that pedophiles who are only attracted to children may abuse more children than pedophiles who also have adult sexual partners. Generally, the only pedophiles who can be studied are those who have both broken the law and been caught and convicted of child sexual abuse. A second reason is that when an adult or teenager sexually abuses a child, people often call the abuser a "pedophile", but it is possible that the abuse happened for a different reason, such as the unavailability of an adult partner. Experts generally define a person as a pedophile only if they are primarily or exclusively sexually attracted to prepubescent children. Some sources, such as the Mayo Clinic, report that most child sexual abuse of prepubescent children is committed by pedophiles, [13] while other studies report that most people who sexually abuse children are not pedophiles. It does not change their sexual attraction. Using this treatment, it is believed that some sex offenders can be prevented from offending again. Medications such as Depo-Provera can be used to treat pedophilia.
