To listen and then impose your preferred solution is not listening. Listening sends the best message of all: Questions are wonderful tools and should be used often. If you want to hear feedback from the other person, just ask. Expressing emotion is important, but always be respectful. What you need to do is find a way to solve the problem. You might begin by mutually clarifying work-related expectations. Pay attention to nonverbal messages. Be careful about your tone of voice, too. If nonverbal messages are overwhelming the conversation, it might be better to wait until things settle. Recognize and reinforce positive behaviors. Effective communication is a constant activity, and you should thank the other person for accommodating you. This is a win-win, and it will keep the channels of communication open.
