Although the purpose of your GED score is to evaluate you compared to recent high school graduates, it is not intended to be a complete assessment of your entire academic capabilities. Your GED Scores are comprised of two items: Each of the four main GED tests reasoning through language arts, mathematical reasoning, social studies, and science is scored on a scale of 1 to 100. The percentile rank ranges from 1 to 100. From onwards, each subject on the GED test will have a passing score of 140. Students will need to score at least a 140 on each subject and a total score of 560 or higher for all four subjects in order to receive the GED test credential. If a student scores a 140 or greater on any subject they will also earn an "Honors" score. Your GED test score is determined by first calculating your raw score, and then determining a scaled score. Your raw GED Score is determined by giving you 1 point for each correct answer and 0 points for each incorrect answer. A scaled score reduces the impact of different test versions and the students who take specific versions. For the current series GED tests a minimum passing standard has been set at 140 across the four content area implying that you score at least a 140. Since the GED credential is granted by the jurisdiction where you reside, they may set a different requirement for passing as long as it is at least meets the minimum GED requirements. Some colleges do not have formal minimum GED scores for admissions. Other colleges, however, have minimum required scores for admission. The short answer is no. A GPA of 3. Each state and jurisdiction may have its own rules governing when and how you can retake the tests. For many people, the GED offers another chance at life for those who may have hit an obstacle during high school which prevented them from graduating at the same time as their peers. Students who are enrolled in high school for four years should be able to work with their guidance counselor and their teachers to make sure they are on the right path to graduation and obtaining a diploma, though sometimes, circumstances change unexpectedly. This could be for a number of different reasons, but it can happen when a student has serious things going on in his/her life, perhaps a sickness, problems in the family or a pregnancy. Whatever the case may be, students who are finding it difficult to stay in school until they graduate can opt to go the GED route instead. Others may have no choice but to do it this way. Where to Take the GED? In order to even be able to take the GED, you must be at least 16 years old. Those working at the testing center can also help you with test preparation, providing information about tutors, study sessions, practice tests, workbooks and more. When you come to take your GED test, you will need to provide an ID, show proof of residency and fill out your application. Here is where you can decide how many tests you want to take at once. Because there are four sections, you can choose to take one test at a time, which is what many test-takers do. You must complete all four sections of the test within three years, though, in order to be eligible to receive your GED. The four subjects are broken up into four separate exams. The Mathematical Reasoning section includes basic math, geometry, basic algebra and graphs and functions. This part of the test is minutes long and is broken up into two parts. The Reasoning Through Language Arts portion of the test is minutes long, plus another 45 minutes for the essay section. It covers topics like reading for meaning, identifying and creating arguments and grammar and language. Next is the social studies section, which is the shortest test at 70 minutes long. The topics that are covered in this section are reading for meaning in social studies, analyzing historical events and arguments in social studies and using numbers and graphs in social studies. The last part of the test is the science section, which covers reading for meaning in science, designing and interpreting science experiments and using numbers and graphics in science. This section is 90 minutes long. Each section on the GED is graded between and points, with being the lowest you can score and being the highest. You must pass each section individually in order to pass the GED in its entirety. In order to pass the GED test, you must obtain a passing score of on each section of the test. This is because the higher score you get, the better your chances are of getting into the college you want. Of course, this all depends on which college you plan on applying to and what their policy is. To be sure, ask the testing center near you what the policy is, and strive to do your absolute best the first time around. Make sure that you feel totally prepared before scheduling your first exam by studying, taking plenty of practice tests and if necessary, working with a tutor or taking a GED preparation course. Depending on your average GED score, you can figure out where you rank. For example, those who score between and are at the top one percent, while those who score a are at the top 85 percent. If you are curious where you stand, then you can check the GED website for more information. Students who earn their high school diploma will know what their GPA is when they graduate. That being said, there is a way to take your GED score and translate your score to a GPA, though it will never be a percent accurate. Then, whatever number you get, multiply that times four. For instance, if you scored a , a , a and a on each of the sections, add those together. Multiply that by four, and you will have an estimated GPA of 3. This is around a B average. After taking one of the tests, you should receive notification that your scores have been posted via email, between three hours and 24 hours after completing the exam. Later, you can order copies of your GED transcripts via the same website, or third-party websites like www.ged.com. The scores are calculated on the basis of the random scores of high school seniors, who took their exam during the spring of their graduation period. These seniors are individuals who satisfy the basic graduation requirements. The scoring chart contains your scores in each section along with other information like, standard score total, battery average, etc. In the following article, we shall discuss about the mark sheet that you receive and examine the process to interpret this chart. The score card displays your scores in all the sections. There are some prominent columns in your report, which illustrate your skill level. Let us discuss these columns in the following points: In this column, you receive your standard scores for each test. Generally, a standard score of is considered as the passing score for that section. The average score is calculated by taking into account the total standard score and the passing average score is The percentile rank shows the percentage of seniors who scored below or above the test taker. A percentile rank of 82 say in the Science section would suggest that the test taker scored better than 82 percent of the graduating seniors. It shows the sum of all the standard scores earned by the test taker. Here, the average of all total standard scores of all the tests is given. The battery average score displays certain aspects of the test taker, such as the skills in interaction, data treatment, solving questions and capacity to solve critical questions. It also shows the skill level in each of the five sections. The skill level suggests your capacity to handle workplaces and high school courses. Your score depends on the number of correctly answered questions and your essay points. A combination of these two would provide you your standard score. You can find out this conversion chart online or in certain books. It is very simple really to interpret the chart. Here is an example of how to interpret your score in Writing Section. There will be one column on your left showing you the number of correctly answered questions within questions and many other columns each column representing a particular essay score within Combining these two you can get your score. For example, if you answer 16 questions correctly and you get an essay score of 3. On the other hand, a candidate answering 25 correct answers and getting an essay score of 3. Hence, there are various combinations of scores in the multiple-choice questions and essay questions in order to postulate your total score for the "Writing section". Your scores portray a lot about your ability and capacity to handle mature courses and college-bound academic courses.
