Faust has an extensive "Notes" section that lists the locations of these documents. One of the most difficult things to find in researching family history is information on our women ancestors. Carter spent many of her early years in Memphis. She attended the University of Memphis and Rhodes College. In college, she was a member of the Delta Delta Delta sorority. In , Carter competed in the Miss Tennessee pageant, where she placed first runner-up to Mickie Weyland. Carter won the Miss Volunteer beauty pageant at the University of Tennessee in the same year. Career[edit] In , Carter made her professional stage debut in a Memphis production of *Carousel* , co-starring George Hearn , who she would go on to marry 17 years later. In , she began an eight-year hiatus from acting, to focus on raising her two daughters; she returned to the craft in , when she filled in for actress Nancy Pinkerton as Dorian Cramer on *One Life to Live* while Pinkerton was on maternity leave. She subsequently was cast in the role of Assistant D. Carter took the role though some advised her that doing a daytime soap might negatively affect her career. However, she was first noticed in this role, and after leaving *Edge of Night* in , she relocated from New York to Los Angeles and pursued prime-time television roles.
