

Chapter 1 : How do I import a .PDF into inDesign? | Adobe Community

I need to create a PDF from InDesign where the client can edit a few text fields. How do I do this? I would also like to make sure the fonts are embedded and will print properly on their end.

Many options are available for this process, allowing a high degree of customization. Often, you can just select the default options, then manipulate the spreadsheet as you would any object in an InDesign document. However, these options also give you plenty of control over the import process so you can create and use the spreadsheet exactly as you need it.

Importing from Excel to InDesign

1. Launch Adobe InDesign and open your current document or create a new document by pressing "Ctrl-N" on the keyboard. If you want to use dynamically linked spreadsheets in your InDesign document, skip to the section on Creating Linked Spreadsheets before returning to this section.
2. Select the "Type Tool" from the Toolbox. Create an insertion point in any text box where you would like the spreadsheet to appear. To create a new text box, drag the Type Tool across a blank section of a page.
3. Select "Place" from the File menu. Select "Import Options" and double-click the Excel file containing your spreadsheet. The Import Options dialog box opens. Click the "Sheet" menu and select the worksheet from the Excel workbook that you want to import. Click the "View" menu to import custom views. This will be grayed out if there are no custom views available. Click the "Cell Range" field to select only a portion of the worksheet to import. By default, all populated cells are selected. Click the "Table" menu to choose one of the four formatting options. An Unformatted Tabbed Text spreadsheet imports the data as text separated by tabs, not by lines. Select "Formatted Table" if you are importing a linked spreadsheet and want the formatting to change in InDesign if the formatting is changed in Excel. Select "Formatted Only Once" to use the formatting style used in Excel as it appears now, without any future changes to the Excel spreadsheet to affect the formatting in the InDesign document. Click the "Cell Alignment" menu to change how data in each cell is aligned. By default, InDesign will use the same alignment as your Excel worksheet. Select the "Include Inline Graphics" option if you want any graphics in the Excel worksheet to be imported. Click the "Number of Decimal Places To Include" text field if you want to specify the maximum number of decimals used. Type that number in the text field. Otherwise, InDesign will replace these with straight marks.

Creating Linked Spreadsheets

Select "Preferences" from the File menu to place dynamically linked spreadsheets into an InDesign document. Click "File Handling" from the Preferences dialog box. This will include the formatting of the InDesign spreadsheet if you selected a "Formatted Table" in the Import Options dialog box when you imported it.

Formatting the Spreadsheet in InDesign

1. Format the spreadsheet as desired after it has been imported into the InDesign document. Unless you are using a linked spreadsheet, you can format it as you would any InDesign table. Double-click the spreadsheet using the Text Tool, then position the tool on any vertical or horizontal line. Drag the line to change the size of the columns or rows beside the line you selected. Drag the Text Tool across the entire table or a group of cells to format it. If desired, you can click the "Table Styles" panel to select predefined formatting for the table or individual cells.

To do this in InDesign, select Type > Show Hidden Characters. Step 4 To add an easily editable underline to your form fields, select the space directly after the name of the field and insert a tab (Tab).

You can create interactive documents with buttons, movies and sound clips, hyperlinks, bookmarks, and page transitions. You can also set up documents in InDesign that can be converted to forms in Acrobat. Each bookmark jumps to a page, text, or graphic in the exported PDF file. Movies and sound clips You can add movies and sound clips to a document, or you can link to streaming video files on the Internet. These movies and sound clips can be played back in the exported PDF file. See Movies and sounds. Hyperlinks In an exported PDF document, clicking a hyperlink jumps to another location in the same document, to a different document, or to a website. Cross-references A cross-reference refers readers from one part of your document to another in the exported PDF file. Cross-references are especially useful in user guides and reference manuals. When a document with cross-references is exported to PDF, the cross-references act as interactive hyperlinks. Page transitions Page transitions apply a decorative effect, such as a dissolve or wipe, when you turn the page in the exported PDF while in Full Screen Mode. Specify a name and location for the file. General tab Pages Indicate whether all pages in the document, or a page range is included. If you select Range, specify a page range, such as , 9 to print pages 1 through 7 and 9. See Specifying pages to print. Export As Indicate whether you want to export the document as pages or spreads. To advance the pages automatically, select Flip Pages Every and specify the number of seconds between page turns. Page Transitions Specify one page transition to apply to all pages during export. If you use the Page Transitions panel to specify transitions, choose the From Document option to use those settings. Select Appearance Only to include the normal state of buttons and the video posters as static elements. Deselect this setting when users of Acrobat 5. This includes recognition of paragraphs, basic text formatting, lists, and tables. You can also insert and adjust tags in the document before exporting to PDF. See Adding structure to PDFs. This option is only available for tagged PDFs. However, file size is reduced with a minimal loss of information. Choose Automatic to let InDesign determine the best quality for color and grayscale images. The higher the quality, the larger the file size. Resolution Specify the resolution of bitmap images in the exported PDF. Choosing a high resolution is especially important to allow viewers to zoom in on pixel-based content within your exported PDF. Choosing a high resolution can significantly increase the file size. Available options are Document Title and File Name. Language Choose the document language for the PDF. This determines the default language for the exported PDF. If the required language is not in the list, you can also type the standard language ISO code. Security tab Require Password To Open The Document Select this option to require users to type the password you specify to open the document. If the file is opened in Illustrator, Photoshop, or InDesign, the user must enter the Permissions password, since it is not possible to open the file in a view-only mode. Permissions Password Specify a password that is required to change the permissions settings. This option is available only if the previous option is selected. None Prevents users from printing the document. Printing may be slower because each page is printed as a bitmap image. High Resolution Lets users print at any resolution, directing high-quality vector output to PostScript and other printers that support advanced high-quality printing features. None Prevents users from making any changes to the document that are listed in the Changes Allowed menu, such as filling in form fields and adding comments. Inserting, Deleting, And Rotating Pages Lets users insert, delete, and rotate pages, and create bookmarks and thumbnails. Any Except Extracting Pages Lets users edit the document, create and fill in form fields, and add comments and digital signatures. You can create a form in InDesign that includes placeholders for fields such as radio buttons, check boxes, and text fields. Then you can export to PDF, and use Acrobat to convert the placeholders into form fields. In InDesign, create the document you want to use for the form. Use tables and text boxes to create the placeholders for the fields. You can also add interactive buttons in InDesign. Export the document to Adobe PDF. Start the form wizard to convert the placeholders into form fields. Use the form tools to add and edit the form. For more information, see the Adobe Acrobat documentation.

Among the preferences you can invoke when you create PDFs from Adobe InDesign, two settings help you maximize the editability of your Acrobat file after you finish exporting it by preserving the elements of your InDesign file on the layers on which you created them.

Design tutorials An editable business card template is one of the most common requests from design clients. Most clients simply want to edit the name and contact info for the business card design , and not the design itself. This allows the client to edit the text in Adobe Reader. While you always need to include the original and fully editable file to the handover on 99designs, this PDF is a great addition that could make things much easier for your client. When creating a design, do your best to select a font that your client already has or is willing to purchase so that they will be able to modify the text. Additionally, when converting you convert your design to a template, make sure to hide any text layers. To add text fields for the name and contact info on the business card template click: Click and drag the text box cursor to create text boxes in the desired size. Edit your Text Field Properties To edit the size and fonts in your text fields, double-click on each text field and edit the text accordingly in the resulting Text Field Properties window. Test your template and send it to your client Next, open your PDF form in Adobe Reader, and test out your text fields by editing the contact info. Most clients will have the program, but if not, they can download it for free. After you or your client edits the contact info in this PDF template, simply save it and send it to the printer. You can come back to this PDF document any time and change the text. Prep for print Some print shops prefer that designers to deliver the business card files as a sheet. Most printers will accept a simple two page PDF file for the business card design. However, in order to print it they will usually line up the business card designs in a grid, print it double-sided and cut the sheet into separate business cards afterwards. There is an easy way to create a (fillable) PDF form using InDesign, but not quite the way you might have imagined. The way I do it is to set up the page in InDesign, with checkboxes and radio buttons created using dingbats, and lines beneath the text fields that need to be filled.

What is a Master Page? The basic principle of a Master page is this: Masters are indispensable when creating multi-page documents like magazines, books, reports and brochures, allowing you to add design elements across a number of specified pages, creating a sense of consistency and professionalism in your document. You can also create multiple Master pages, each with different design elements. You might have one Master page for the opening page of a chapter, and another Master for the pages that sit within the chapter. You can also add different Masters for index pages and contents pages, which may require different page numbering systems or headers. The A-Master is automatically applied to all the pages in your new document, which means that anything you put onto the A-Master will show up on all pages of your document. Masters are quick and simple to edit—simply double-click on one of the Master page icons in the Pages panel to bring it up on screen. You can now edit the Master as you would a normal page.

Step 1 In this document, I want to create a Master that will add a few consistent elements to the pages of articles in the magazine. This is a two-page Master as the document has been set up with facing pages; clicking on either the left or right page of the Master will bring up the full spread on screen. Think about the elements that will remain consistent across a group of pages. You can only edit these elements on the Master, and they will all sit behind the page content, so try to focus on elements that make up the background and basic template of your page. First, I take the Rectangle Tool M and drag onto the Master to create a rectangle that fills the entire left-hand page. By keeping the color in separate shapes on each page I can apply only the left- or right-hand page to a spread in my magazine. If I was to extend a single shape across the whole of the spread, the color would be applied to both pages of a spread automatically.

Step 3 I can also add page numbers to my A-Master. To do this, I zoom into the bottom left-hand corner of the left page, and use the Type Tool T to create a text frame. By clicking on one of the page icons in the lower part of the Pages panel I am taken back to my document. I can see that the pages have all been updated with the edits I made to the A-Master. I then have two choices. Or I can create a new Master page to apply to different pages. For example, I might want to create a second Master which has the same page numbers and headers, but has a white background and black text instead. This opens up a New Master dialogue box. From here you can set the specs for your new Master. If you want to create a new Master that contains all the elements of an existing Master and you simply want to build on this you can choose the appropriate Master from the Based on Master menu. However, as here I want to create a Master with similar elements to the A-Master but I want to be able to edit them too, I can simply create a copy of the Master by selecting both pages of the A-Master hold down Shift while you do this and dragging it down onto the Create New Page icon at the bottom of the Pages panel. From here I can edit this new B-Master, such as removing the colored background and editing the text to a black color. To apply this B-Master to other pages in the document, I select either the left or right page of the B-Master in the Pages panel and drag and drop it onto the relevant pages.

Pro Tips for Using Masters Master pages can be as simple or complex as you like. If you want your document to look extremely consistent, you can edit the Master to include elements that will help your whole document feel even more uniform. Here are just a few things you can do with Master pages that will help take your designs to the next level: You can add linked text frames to your Master. This is particularly handy for typesetting long, text-heavy documents like books. You can create as many Master pages as you like. For long documents some designers will use a wide range of Masters, treating them as templates for specific sections of a book or magazine. You will be prompted with a warning message if the Master is applied to pages in your document. If you go ahead with the deletion, InDesign will apply the [None] Master to the affected page s. Edit Article How to Make a PDF from InDesign. InDesign allows you to create newsletters, brochures and flyers, but sharing those creations can be a problem.

InDesign now supports form fields and additional form actions. You can add simple form elements within the document pages. Common field types such as text fields, radio buttons, check boxes, or signatures are supported. You can also add actions to submit the form by email or to print it. In addition to the basic design, you can also use creative capabilities in InDesign to add a designer touch to your form. Add solid strokes and fills to the PDF form fields. Add custom On, Off, and Hover states for buttons, check boxes, and radio buttons. Specify font size for text input fields. For example, to collect credit card information, you could use credit card icons as radio buttons, with a different image for the selected state. For advanced form workflows, you can export the basic form and then continue editing it in Adobe Acrobat. Add a form field Use the Buttons and Forms panel to add form fields to the layout. You can create a form that works with Adobe Reader or Adobe Acrobat. Buttons and Forms panel Place a frame at the location where you want to place the form field. Enter a name for the form field. To create a radio button group, all the individual buttons must have the same name. Choose an event and add actions to associate with it. For a radio button, check box, or buttons: InDesign adds default graphics for the various states, but you can add your own. For a list box, combo box, or text field: Specify tab order To create user friendly and accessible forms, it is necessary to assign a usable tab order. Users can navigate through the form fields without using a pointing device. Pressing the Tab key shifts the focus to the next logical field. There are two methods of specifying a tab order in a tagged PDF: Drag the form fields to the Articles panel. In the articles panel, drag to reorder the fields in the required order.

In this tutorial I show you how to create an interactive PDF within Adobe InDesign CC. An interactive PDF is one that can be interacted with by the user.

Master Pages What is a Master Page? A Master Page is a nonprinting page that you can use as the template for the rest of the pages in your document. Master pages can contain text and graphic elements that will appear on all pages of a publication. By default, every InDesign document you create contains two masters, one for pages on the left and one for those on the right. To view the default InDesign Master Page: Make sure the Pages Panel is showing by going to the Window menu, then clicking Pages. Remember, there is a left and a right page to the master, so be sure you are on the page you want to be. Alternatively, you can use the navigation tool at the bottom left of the screen to choose the A-Master page. You are now able to make global edits to your document by inserting text boxes and graphics the same way you would on the normal pages. You can also add columns that will affect all pages related to the master. Here is a good tutorial on how to set up and edit your master page: For a more detailed explanation of how the right and left master pages work, as well as how to insert page numbers using master pages, watch this tutorial: You can do this without creating a whole new master, but rather just override the one you are currently using. In the Pages Panel right-click on the page icon for the page you want to change. You can now click on any element on the page and change or delete it. **Multiple Master Pages** You can create as many masters as you want or need – for example, you want a colored box down the left margin of just some pages; you could create a master that has this look, and then apply it to only the pages that need it. To add a new master, go to the Pages Panel, click on the far right arrow with three lines circled at right and choose New Master. In the subsequent dialog box, give it a name if you want and then click OK. Select the appropriate master to change by double-clicking it, and then edit it as you wish. To apply it to a page, drag the master icon onto the page icon in the Pages Panel, or right-click on the page icon and choose Apply Master to Pages and choose the correct master for the page.
