

Chapter 1 : IELTS Exam Preparation - Vocabulary for IELTS

Why is it important? Of all the skills and techniques you need to do well in the IELTS test, vocabulary is definitely one of the most important. IELTS vocabulary preparation can be overwhelming, but this page will help you with everything you need to know before doing your test. Take a look at the table below. The table shows words in the question from an official IELTS reading test on the left and words in the text on the right. It demonstrates how many synonyms are used and therefore, needed to answer the question. You are not learning the words in context. That means that you are not learning the words within a sentence and paragraph and you will not know how they are supposed to be used properly. Lots of my students in the past have downloaded long lists of words and thought that they could simply learn them by memorising them. This is the single worst thing you can do to improve your vocabulary. The result was always the same: The Correct Way to Learn IELTS Vocabulary The only way that you can learn new words and then use them properly is if you learn them from context, or in other words, from real sources of information, not lists. Below is a 5 step plan to help you increase your range of vocabulary. Pick a book, TV show, radio show, podcast or magazine you are interested in. People learn more effectively when they enjoy what they are doing. Buy a special notebook. Listen or read and try to guess what they mean from the context. This step is very important because it will help you remember them. Note the 15 new words down in your notebook. Look up the new words in a dictionary. You can do this online. Beside each word note the meaning, an example sentence or two, collocations, synonyms, antonyms, and pronunciation. You can also draw pictures; whatever will help you remember the word. Review the new words after one week, two weeks and then one month. Also, practice using the new words in a sentence. If you do this five days a week, after a month you will have nearly new words in your notebook. After 6 months you will have at least new words. The human mind can only effectively remember around 15 new words in a foreign language per day, so any more and you will not learn them properly and make mistakes. This method is the single most powerful way I know for learning vocabulary and lots of my students have been successful with it. Also, you need to know collocations of words. Where is a large vocabulary useful? In the Reading Test, candidates with a large vocabulary are likely to score better. So, to crack the Reading Test, you need a large vocabulary. Here is an example of why you would need an extensive vocabulary in Reading Test. As per the text above, is the statement below True, False or Not Given? If you know the meaning of the word scorn, or at least guess that it has a negative meaning from the context by reading the full sentence, you can answer it correctly. Scorn means contempt or disrespect and hence, the answer is False. What kind of vocabulary should I have? My advice is, learn two sets of vocabulary – one for the Reading test, and another for writing and speaking. Well, not really; but, then what is easy in this world? Have a pages book for noting down new words. The first half you can use for Vocabulary for Reading, and the second half Maybe, you should start from the back of the book for Writing and Speaking vocabulary. In the case of vocabulary for Reading, you need to collect a wide range of words. Write the synonyms or short meaning of the word. No need to learn their usage. For writing and speaking vocabulary, do not learn difficult and complicated words. To get a score of 7 or even 8, you need only a limited vocabulary. Learn words that we normally use to express ideas effectively. Learn their usage, collocation, derivatives. You should be able to use them confidently in writing and speaking correctly.
