How to navigate Tips for solving multiple choice questions Do not spend more than 45 seconds on each question. If you need more time to answer it, skip it and come back to it later. Read the question and answer first in your head, before looking at the answer options. Answer as many questions as possible this way, and it will minimize second-guessing and lack of confidence about your answers. You can divide the entire test into two cycles. The first pass is really fast. Answer questions quickly, without spending any extra time on answers you are unsure of. Flag any and all questions you want to re-visit, and use your first instinctual answer on all questions. This strategy may help with questions later on in the exam that you are not totally confident about “ sometimes, earlier questions, and answers, give clues to those further on in the exam. The second cycle is what you use to go back to those questions that were the most difficult, as well as those for which you have no idea what the answer is, and have to make a guess. For tough questions, use process of elimination to narrow down your answer and give yourself a better chance of the right one. You can also try working the question in reverse, this may give you a new perspective.
