Get Started With Lost Title Replacement Assistance Online Online assistance is available to help you get through the title replacement process as quickly as possible. If your car title has been lost, damaged or stolen, replacing it is crucial. Without a valid certificate of title, you may have trouble transferring ownership of your vehicle, and depending on where you live, ordering a duplicate may not be straightforward. Gathering the right documents ahead of time and understanding the duplicate title application will save you time and effort in the long run. By Mail Receiving assistance by mail often takes longer and requires more work than getting help quickly online. However, some people prefer to deal with DMV processes in this manner. When performing DMV transactions by mail, you will need to set aside enough time for your correspondence to reach the DMV office and for the DMV to mail you a response. Additionally, be sure to double-check all applications, documents and payments, since correcting these items by mail will add to your wait time. However, you can make these visits as short and effective as possible by preparing beforehand. Knowing which documents to bring and what steps you need to take before visiting an office in person will help you take full advantage of your trip. Since not all DMV offices offer the same types of services, make sure you use the online assistance to help you get ready. Motor vehicle owners can request a replacement car title in the event of a lost or stolen title certificate, among other reasons. The state DMV currently offers two replacement methods, including in person and via mail. Each method will require applicants to submit specific documentation and provide payment for the set fees. To learn more about the methods for replacement, motorists can continue reading the applicable sections below. Vehicle owners will be able to request duplicate car ownership documents in several instances. One of the reasons for applying to replace a lost car title at the DMV is if the original certificate of title is lost or stolen. Another instance whereby individuals can apply for a duplicate is if the previous document has been destroyed. Once the Division of Motor Vehicles issues an NH lost car title replacement, the original title will no longer be valid. Finalizing this replacement title application procedure in a timely manner is important, as title certificates are usually required in other procedures, such as title transfers and vehicle registration , among others. To complete the duplicate paperwork request successfully, you will first need to fill out a replacement title application form completely and correctly. When learning how to replace a vehicle title in NH, you may also need to submit a lien release. However, this requirement will vary if the title is held by a lienholder. When you replace a lost car title in person or by mail, you must provide an accepted form of payment to pay the replacement fees. If you change your address on the application for duplicate credentials, the DMV will also update your other records, such as your registration address. This will ensure that, during a car title search, your information will match across all of your credentials. You cannot replace a car title online, as the DMV offers limited online services. You may apply for the duplicate certificate of title in person and by mail. The requirements for both methods are similar, and both request methods include submitting the relevant replacement title application form and fee payment, along with any supporting documents, as necessary. Before visiting a DMV title office personally, however, it is best to contact the department and check whether any photo ID will be necessary for completing a replacement transaction. By Mail Motor vehicle owners who choose to replace a car title by mail will need to provide the state Division of Motor Vehicles with the applicable documentation and provide payment. The application package for an NH lost car title replacement includes a properly completed application form, a lien release if applicable and a check or money order for the fee. The documents for replacing a vehicle title will need to be submitted to the address provided on the application form. If the vehicle has two owners listed on the certificate of title, both owners must sign the replacement request. In Person Applying to replace a lost car title in person in New Hampshire is an available option to vehicle owners who are not able to request a duplicate by mail. The in-person request at a nearby NH DMV title office will also include submitting a completed application form, fee payment and any additional paperwork that may be necessary to prove an

address or name change, if necessary. Prior to presenting their replacement title application forms, it is best for applicants to ensure they have completed the document completely and accurately to avoid rejection of their request. On the application, you must fill out the owner information and details about the vehicle. When submitting a replacement car title request, you may need to include: The reason for requesting a duplicate title. Your driving license If you are the co-owner of the vehicle, the other owner must also include his or her license number. Owner details with a current mailing address. Vehicle information, such as the make and model. Lienholder information, if applicable. Authorization for mailing to licensed dealer, if necessary. The signature or signatures of the owner or owners. Making a false or fraudulent statement in a replacement title application form is punishable by law, and may result in the issuance of severe penalties and additional consequences. Since completing certain procedures by mail takes longer than doing so online, be sure to follow directions carefully when filling out an application, attaching documents and paying fees, since by-mail payment options are usually limited. In these cases, preparing beforehand can save you time and effort. A certificate of title is a legal document issued by the NH DMV and it serves as proof of ownership over a certain motor vehicle. Motorists who want to perform a car title transfer need to know that this procedure is created for transferring the ownership rights to the person who purchases the vehicle. However, both legal entities may perform a motor vehicle title transfer procedure by preparing the mandatory documentation and presenting it at the NH DMV. Although you cannot complete title transfer online, you may be able to access electronic records after the transfer. For more information about how to fill out transfer of title in New Hampshire, motorists are encouraged to contact a nearby DMV and discover further details. When is a vehicle title transfer required in New Hampshire? A process of motor vehicle title transfer in New Hampshire may be required under various circumstances and in different situations. Motorists who want to perform a car title transfer need to learn the instances when such procedure is mandatory. The most common instance when a transfer of car title is required is when both new and used motor vehicles are purchased, regardless of whether they have been bought from a private party or from a dealership. Dealerships and lien agencies may have access to electronic title transfers but it is always a good idea to have a physical copy of this document for your records. Moreover, New Hampshire title transfers for cars may be also required when a motor vehicle is received as a gift, inheritance or donation. In such situations, motorists may have to provide additional documentation to that one that is required when buying a motor vehicle. Information and Documents Necessary to Transfer a Title in New Hampshire A car title transfer in New Hampshire is a procedure that must be performed by both the sellers and buyers of a motor vehicle. Therefore, when performing a title transfer for cars, both legal entities need to prepare the following documents: Car title, completed by the vehicle seller Current or expired car registration card or vehicle title, for exempt vehicles Bill of sale , for exempt vehicles VIN verification, if needed Payment for the applicable title transfer fee Payment for the mandatory car registration fees Note that a process of transferring a car title may require motorists to provide additional documents, depending on their specific situation. Individuals who want to perform title transfers for cars in New Hampshire need to inform themselves about the exact paperwork they need to prepare before beginning the procedure at the DMV. If you

An application for a new, New Hampshire title is completed either by a New Hampshire dealership at the time a vehicle is purchased or by a town/city clerk at the time a vehicle is registered. The dealership or clerk's office will forward the completed Title Application to the DMV for processing.

Chapter 4 : New Hampshire Division of Motor Vehicles - Forms

If you purchase a vehicle from a dealer in New Hampshire, the dealer is responsible for completing the title application and submitting it to the New Hampshire Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to complete the vehicle title transfer. They will also submit the DMV title transfer fee on your behalf.
