The cue point is set as the initial start point on a track or can be moved when play is started at a different point. For instance, if the music is paused, pressing play will set a new cue point. Voltage Selector - Set this switch to the voltage for your location. In order to use the digital output you should not use variable pitch slider and the pitch bend buttons. If you adjust the pitch, other devices may not read the digital output properly because the sampling rate changes. Relay Connector- If you wish to use the relay function plug in your 3. The cable must be a stereo style plug for the units to work properly. Remote Start Connector - Use this connector to plug into your fader start compatible mixer or remote switch. This function is always active. To use this connector for fader start, connect the supplied fader start cable to a fader start compatible mixer. Every time you move the crossfader on the mixer over to the side that the unit is on, it will automatically start playing. When you move the fader away from that side, the unit will stop. Moving the fader back to the unit side will start play again. This means that when the unit is remotely stopped it will go back to the cue point automatically. Remote Assignment Switch - Set this switch in the position for the method of remote start you will be using. Foot switches are often used for creative mixing techniques and can be found in most music shops. There are also two types of footswitches that will work with this connector. The second switch is a momentary footswitch and is usually used for keyboard sustain pedals. If you are unsure of the style of switch you have, try each position until it works as desired. CUE - Flashing when the unit is setting a cue point. Lit continuously when the unit is paused at a cue point. This shows the frames elapsed or remaining depending on mode setting. Remain indicates when track remain time is displayed. Total indicates when total CD remain time is displayed note: Numeric display - indicating either current pitch or BPM. PITCH - is lit when pitch is being displayed. This is called the cue point. This function is called back cue. The CD player will repeatedly play small parts of the CD as you move it to the desired position.

Before we talk about tips and suggestions, first we need to distinguish CD-R from other similar CD types. The disks you buy should just say CD-R. All CD-R disks will work with our products. My personal favorite My latest analogy for this topic is Riding on bald tires He tells me I need 4 new tires when I go in for an oil change. Likewise, buy quality media, and burn your disks slow. Here are some additional general information on the subject of Skipping and Read failures: Skipping and read failures generally result when all of the different errors the player encounters in the reading process, added together, are too much for the buffer. Minimizing the numbers of errors the player encounters may resolve the problem. The first, and easiest step is to clean the CD lens with a CD lens cleaning kit. If a transport mechanism becomes dirty or worn, it will begin to have problems reading disks that contain many errors. The next thing you should do is question the readability of the disks: CD players will often fail to read a disk when the errors on the disk are great enough to overrun its buffer. Media type, burn speed and scratches all have a great effect on the number of errors that will be present on your disk. The errors are normally handled by the memory buffer, but if the number of errors exceeds the buffer, the disk will either skip or not read. Burned CD-R Disks will always have more errors on them than store-bought disks. It is more difficult for CD players to handle them. It is important to minimize any additional errors to make it as easy as possible for your player to read your CD-R disks. Use high quality CD-R Disks: High quality CD-R disks have a better physical makeup than cheaper ones, and will go through the burning process with less errors than cheaper disks. They will also last longer and be more resistant to scratches. Taiyo Yuden disks, for example are very good quality. Burn your disks slower: The faster you burn your disks, the more errors they will contain. We recommend burning at 4x speed or slower. Keep in mind that if a disk already has many errors on it, it will be much harder for your CD player to handle any scratches that the disk may pick up in the future. Additionally, all CD burners, and CD burning programs are not created equal. While the speed at which you burn is the most important factor that you can control, some burners and software will check the disk for errors after burning. This can save a lot of headaches for you. Some burners and programs have better testing than others though. Lastly, if your lens is clean, and your disks are properly burned on good media, and you are still having problems The only other factor is the transport mechanism itself being worn or malfunctioning. If the lens is clean and the disks are good, and your player is still skipping, your product will need to be seen by a service technician to be repaired. Hope that this helps!
