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Olaf College Save St. Olaf College is a co-educational, residential, four-year, private liberal arts college in Northfield, Minnesota , United States. It was founded in by a group of Norwegian-American immigrant pastors and farmers, led by Pastor Bernt Julius Muus. With nearly all the immigrants being Lutheran Christians , they desired a non-secular post-secondary institution in the Lutheran tradition that offered classes in all subjects in both Norwegian and English. The catalyst for founding St. Together they petitioned their parishes and others to raise money in order to buy a plot of land on which to build this new institution. Graduate and Family Summer Support The transition between middle school and high school is an important and challenging time. Through the Graduate and Family Support Summer program, incoming freshmen practice the math and reading skills required at their high schools. They also learn life and study skills that will help them prepare for their new role as high school students. During this summer program, the recent CPS graduates attend trips to college campuses. This year, they visited St. Acellus Blended Learning Summer School Students who have struggled academically throughout the school year receive personalized help to master academic skills needed to advance. They achieve success through this summer program, which combines live instruction with online help in the classroom through the Acellus video system. CPS was nationally recognized as a role model for Catholic education in inner-cities in features published in the National Catholic Register and the National Catholic Reporter. Sister Karen was also featured in Op-Ed pieces in the Philadelphia Inquirer and Courier Post, stressing the value of small class sizes at CPS and elsewhere in educating young inner-city children. In collaboration with the Camden Youth Aviation Program, CPS provides 6th – 8th grade students with an academic enrichment program focusing on aviation. Students in the group meet weekly and learn about science, technology, engineering, math and the arts. In March, the Aviation students were given a wonderful opportunity to fly in an airplane from South Jersey Regional Airport. It was the first time that a number of our students had ever flown in an airplane! It is an obligation of schools to ensure mastery of core, foundational skills in reading and mathematics.
