Millions of families have been devastated by the "overcriminalization" of peoDr. Benjamin B l a c k Chavis Jr. A m e r i c a n families in particular have suffered and continue to suffer disproportionately as a result of an unjust system of justice. When I was unjustly incarcerated in the s as member of the famed Wilmington Ten civil rights case, I personally witnessed how the massive warehousing of prison inmates in overcrowded prison cells led to unspeakable dehumanization and self-destruction. In fact, the inhumanity and senselessness of the prison system itself directly contributed to the increased in violence and prison recidivism. Today, however, the dysfunction of the criminal justice system is not only a matter of national and global disgrace, it has also now become a multi-billion dollar counterproductive albatross around the neck of the nation. African Americans are incarcerated at nearly six times the rate of Whites; Together, African American and Hispanics comprised 58 percent of all prisoners in , even though African Americans and Hispanics make up approximately one quarter of the U. If current trends continue, one in three Black males born today can expect to spend time in prison during his lifetime 1 in African American women are in prison Nationwide, AfricanAmericans represent 26 percent of juvenile arrests, 44 percent of youth who are detained, 46 percent of the youth who are judicially waived to criminal court, and 58 percent of the youth admitted to state prisons Center on Juvenile and Criminal Justice. The recent public outcries about allegations of police brutality, prosecutorial misconduct, and unfair targeting of judicial sanctions based on race and socioeconomic status are all symptoms of a much border and larger systemic problem. The problems of inequalities within the criminal justice system are structural and institutional. Yet, the calls for reform of the criminal justice system are not revolutionary or misplaced. What is missing is a sense of urgency to get reform actions and policies established. Every day and every hour Black America is negatively impacted by the criminal justice system. The Pew Charitable Trust has a study that documents the correlation between mass incarceration and the persistence of poverty in the U. There is no question that in the Black American community the lingering negative effects of imprisonment and poverty are closely related. Similarly a revealing Villanova University study on poverty and criminal justice found that "had mass incarceration not occurred, poverty would have decreased by more than 20 percentâ€¦. It is urgent and it is long overdue. So many lives and so many families are at risk. If we do not assert the responsibility to demand change and reform of a system that continues to brutalize and harm our families and communities, then we will not be our sisters and brothers keepers as we should. What is generally missing from discussions during this time period is anything having to do with race. Yet race is a central factor for both Ireland and, ironically, Irish Americans. The manner in which we understand "race" today is directly related to the English conquest of Ireland in the 17th century. The English introduced a form of oppression of the indigenous people that ended up being very effective. They expropriated their lands, crushed their religion, totally eliminated their ruling class, and instituted a form of colonial rule through which the native Irish were defined in law and custom as inferior. The English defined themselves as a superior "race" compared with the indigenous Irish. And they proceeded to keep Ireland as a colony until the 19th century, and have kept the northern part of Ireland the six counties colonized to this day. In order to guarantee their domination of Ireland, the English sent in settlers from England, Scotland and Wales, giving them the best land and privileging them over the native Irish. The settlers, whether rich or poor, in a pattern that became familiar in other parts of the world as colonialism spread, were always in a superior position to the native Irish. For all intents and purposes, the Irish had no rights that the settlers were bound to respect. Fleeing English oppression and poverty, thousands of Irish set out for other parts of the world. When they first came to North America, while the British still occupied what is now the U.

Upon graduation in , Stoney set out traveling across the South and wrote a daily column for the News and Observer in which he recorded his observations of the region as it faced fundamental social change. He moved to New York, N. The Negro Problem and Modern Democracy. Stoney next worked as a publicist for the Farm Security Administration FSA , trying to raise middle class support for sharecropper and tenant farmer programs in Alabama, Georgia, Florida, and South Carolina. He met his future wife, Mary Newcomb Bruce , while stationed in England. In , he joined the Southern Educational Film Production Service at the University of Georgia as writer of educational films for federal and state agricultural, educational, and public health agencies. The first film he wrote, directed, and produced was Palmour Street, about an African American family in Gainesville, Ga. Then in , he moved to Washington, D. He also started with Nicholas Read a production company, Potomac Film Producers, that specialized in socially relevant films for government agencies, non-profit organizations, and corporate sponsors. In , Stoney started his own production company, George C. One of his earliest and most important films is the award-winning All My Babies , produced for the Georgia Department of Health. Through the next two decades, Stoney pioneered the field of socially relevant documentary filmmaking while teaching and training the next generation of filmmakers at the University of Southern California, the City College of New York, Columbia University, Stanford University, the International Honors Program, and at other leading American universities with film study programs. From to , Stoney served as executive producer for the Challenge for Change project, a socially active documentary production wing of the National Film Board of Canada, that encouraged ordinary people to use media as a means to improve the quality of their lives. Stoney returned to the United States in to head up the undergraduate film department at New York University and to continue to produce his own films and videos. George Stoney also is considered the father of public access television. Building on his work at the National Film Board of Canada, Stoney advocated the use of cable television channels by the public to enact social change. In , he co-founded the Alternate Media Center, which trained citizens in the uses of video technology for use on public access television. In , he was a founding member of the National Federation of Local Cable Programmers now called the Alliance for Community Media as an advocacy and support group for the cable movement. He has been a mentor and teacher to generations of filmmakers worldwide. Stoney died in Correspondence between Stoney and his long-time companion Betty Puleston d. It was continued in the "Borough of The Bronx", which included a larger annexation from Westchester County in The use of the definite article is attributed to the style of referring to rivers. Generally, the definite article is lowercase in place names "the Bronx" except in official references to the borough. It would be capitalized "The Bronx" at the beginning of a sentence or in any other situation when a normally lowercase word would be capitalized. These people say that the definite article is part of the proper name. Timeline of the Bronx European colonization of the Bronx began in Over time, European colonists converted the borough into farmlands. Control over the bridges across the Harlem River plagued the period of British colonial rule. The present Bronx County was contained in the town of Westchester and parts of the towns in Yonkers , Eastchester , and Pelham. In , a new town was created by division of Westchester, called West Farms. The town of Morrisania was created, in turn, from West Farms in In , the town of Kingsbridge was established within the former borders of Yonkers, roughly corresponding to the modern Bronx neighborhoods of Kingsbridge, Riverdale , and Woodlawn. Among famous settlers in the Bronx during the 19th and early 20th centuries were author Willa Cather , tobacco merchant Pierre Lorillard , and inventor Jordan L. Mott , who established Mott Haven to house the workers at his iron works. In , the state legislature annexed Kingsbridge, West Farms, and Morrisania to New York, effective in ; the three towns were soon abolished in the process. This included the Town of Westchester which had voted against consolidation in and portions of Eastchester and Pelham. On January 1, , the consolidated City of New York was born, including the Bronx as one of the five distinct boroughs. After [edit] The history of the Bronx during the 20th century may be divided into four periods: The mid to late century were hard times, as the Bronx declined €"85 from a predominantly moderate-income to a predominantly lower-income area with high rates of violent crime and poverty. The Bronx has experienced an economic and developmental resurgence starting in the late s that continues into today. The Bronx was a mostly rural area for many generations, small farms supplying the city markets, but it grew into a railroad suburb in the late 19th century. In addition, French , German , Polish , and other immigrants moved into the borough. The Jewish population also increased notably during this time. In , , Jews lived in The Bronx Many synagogues still stand in the Bronx, but most have been converted to other uses. Irish, Italian, Jewish, and Polish gangs smuggled in most of the illegal whiskey, and the oldest sections of the borough became poverty-stricken. Between and , moderate and upper income Bronxites predominantly non-Hispanic Whites began to relocate from the southwestern neighborhoods of the borough. One significant factor that shifted the racial and economic demographics was the construction of Co-op City, built with the intent of housing middle-class residents in family-sized apartments. Most predominantly non-Hispanic White communities today are located in the eastern and northwestern sections of the borough. From the early s to the early s, the quality of life declined sharply for many Bronx residents. Others have suggested a " planned shrinkage " of municipal services, such as fire-fighting. The burning of buildings was predominantly in the poorest communities, such as the South Bronx. One explanation of what occurred was that landlords decided

to burn their low property-value buildings and take the insurance money, as it was more lucrative to get insurance money than to refurbish or sell a building in a severely distressed area. However, starting in the s, many burned-out and run-down tenements were replaced by multi-unit housing. The Bronx has seen an increase in revitalization in recent years. Groups affiliated with churches in the South Bronx erected the Nehemiah Homes with about 1, units. Chains such as Marshalls , Staples , and Target opened stores in the Bronx. More bank branches opened in the Bronx as a whole rising from in to in , although not primarily in poor or minority neighborhoods, while the Bronx still has fewer branches per person than other boroughs. Much of the new development is springing up in formerly vacant lots across the South Bronx.

Born in Santo Domingo of Portuguese and African descent, he arrived in Manhattan during the winter of 1609, trapping for pelts and trading with the local population as a representative of the Dutch. Dutch rule A permanent European presence in New Netherland began in 1614 making New York the 12th oldest continuously occupied European-established settlement in the continental United States [94] with the founding of a Dutch fur trading settlement on Governors Island. This program had little success. In 1614, in an effort to bolster economic growth, the Dutch West India Company relinquished its monopoly over the fur trade, leading to growth in the production and trade of food, timber, tobacco, and slaves particularly with the Dutch West Indies. During his tenure, the population of New Netherland grew from 2, to 8, He instituted regulations on liquor sales, attempted to assert control over the Dutch Reformed Church , and blocked other religious groups including Quakers , Jews , and Lutherans from establishing houses of worship. Discovery of the African Burying Ground in the 1790s, during construction of a new federal courthouse near Foley Square , revealed that tens of thousands of Africans had been buried in the area in the colonial years. The trial and acquittal in Manhattan of John Peter Zenger , who had been accused of seditious libel after criticizing colonial governor William Cosby , helped to establish the freedom of the press in North America. The Stamp Act Congress met in New York in October , as the Sons of Liberty , organized in the city, skirmished over the next ten years with British troops stationed there. The Battle of Long Island , the largest battle of the American Revolutionary War , was fought in August within the modern-day borough of Brooklyn. After the battle, in which the Americans were defeated, the British made the city their military and political base of operations in North America. The city was a haven for Loyalist refugees and escaped slaves who joined the British lines for freedom newly promised by the Crown for all fighters. As many as 10,000 escaped slaves crowded into the city during the British occupation. When the British forces evacuated at the close of the war in 1783, they transported 3,000 freedmen for resettlement in Nova Scotia. They resettled other freedmen in England and the Caribbean. The only attempt at a peaceful solution to the war took place at the Conference House on Staten Island between American delegates , including Benjamin Franklin , and British general Lord Howe on September 11, 1783. Shortly after the British occupation began, the Great Fire of New York occurred, a large conflagration on the West Side of Lower Manhattan, which destroyed about a quarter of the buildings in the city, including Trinity Church. New York was the last capital of the U. New York interracial abolitionist activism continued; among its leaders were graduates of the African Free School. The completion of the Erie Canal through central New York connected the Atlantic port to the agricultural markets and commodities of the North American interior via the Hudson River and the Great Lakes. In 1776, Mayor Fernando Wood called upon the aldermen to declare independence from Albany and the United States after the South seceded, but his proposal was not acted on. Rioters burned the Colored Orphan Asylum to the ground, with more than 100 children escaping harm due to efforts of the New York City Police Department , which was mainly made up of Irish immigrants. McPherson , at least 100 people were killed. In all, eleven black men were lynched over five days, and the riots forced hundreds of blacks to flee the city for Williamsburg , Brooklyn, and New Jersey; the black population in Manhattan fell below 10,000, by 1790, which it had last been in 1625.
