They will explain the commandments and what they mean in simple, easy-to-understand terms. Both my kids and I learned a ton! Some of what I learned: That coveting does not mean wanting what someone else has. That Do Not Steal is more than just personal property. That we are only commanded to honor our mother and father. That does not mean we are commanded to honor other human beings. Note definition of honorâ€”different than respect. This is the only commandment that is unforgiveable. Remember the Sabbath is for us to restâ€”to be more than a worker, to be free or we are slaves, and to make slavery impossible. It also strengthens the family as we are forced to spend time with other human beings. And animals were granted dignity as well. And all of this affirms God. Without God who brought us out of Egypt, there is no moral compass. With one God, we are all equal. All of the commandments are for the function of society and to keep it prospering. Otherwise, we are doomed. This is just a bit of what I learned. I cannot recommend this site enough. It is not a university per se as we know it; just a site free to all with five minute videos discussing issues of the day including theology founded by Dennis Prager , a conservative radio talk show host and columnist. I can not speak for the site; all I can recommend are these videos. I watched these alongside my kids and because they are short and sometimes entertaining my kids were engaged the entire 50 minutes. Chapter 2 : Memorize the Ten Commandments â€“ LifeSong Publishers

Remember the 10 Commandments Easy as 1,2,3 I love this book for teaching the 10 Commandments! Because of the picture for each commandment it is easy to remember.

The 4th commandment is written in Exodus chapter 20 verses 8 to 11 and says: Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days shalt thou labour, and do all thy work: But the seventh day is the sabbath of the Lord thy God: For in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them is, and rested the seventh day: This commandment is really quite simple. It says to rest on the 7th day of the week which is Saturday. There is no need to make this commandment more complex than it is. The day of rest was created by God when he created the world, and has nothing to do with the people of Israel and was not done away with by Jesus Christ. This day of rest was created for humanity and is our battery charger for the week. Did Muhammad Remember the Sabbath Day? In the Quran Al-Baqara verse 65 it says: And certainly you have known those among you who exceeded the limits of the Sabbath, so We said to them: Be as apes, despised and hated. There is another whole story behind this verse, but it is plain to see that the Sabbath was important to Muhammad. Especially since Allah made those who broke it into apes according to this verse. Also in the Quran, An-Nisa verse And We lifted the mountain Sainai over them at the li taking of the covenant and We said to them: Enter the door making obeisance; and We said to them: Do not exceed the limits of the Sabbath, and We made with them a firm covenant. Again you can see that Muhammad recognized the sabbath day. But did he keep it? Most likely this was caused by him wanting to separate himself from the Jewish people. In An-Nahl verse he wrote: And Muhammad made Friday the sabbath for Muslims. So Muhammad broke the 4th commandment in the following 2 ways: He deliberately broke it by changing it to Friday. And said every nation has their own day of rest. When in fact he changed it to Friday to build a separation from the Jews, just like Christians did in the day of Constantine when they moved to Sunday. Nothing bad happens to us if we do not keep this commandment, at least that we are able to see.

These 10 beneficial laws were given by the Creator God to show us how to live a better life now and please God forever. There are only slight differences of emphasis in the accounts. Both versions are listed below, along with a list of the commandments in short form. The numbering of the commandments on the first three lists below reflects the numbering used in much of the Christian world, though Catholics, Jews and others use various numbering systems as shown below that. You shall not make idols. Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Honor your father and your mother. You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. You shall not covet. The 10 Commandments List in Exodus You shall have no other gods before Me. For I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children to the third and fourth generations of those who hate Me, but showing mercy to thousands, to those who love Me and keep My commandments. In it you shall do no work: For in six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested the seventh day. You shall not make yourself a carved image nor any likeness of that which is in the heavens above or on the earth below or in the water beneath the earth. You shall not prostrate yourself to them nor worship them, for I am the Lord, your God. Six days shall you work and accomplish all your work; but the seventh day is Sabbath to the Lord, your God; you shall not do any workâ€”you, your son, your daughter, your servant, your animal, and the stranger within your gatesâ€”for in six days The Lord made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them, and He rested on the seventh day. Perhaps for many this is old hat, but it was new to me and certainly caused me to pause and think. Moses first consecrates the people, and he tells them to cleanse themselves and prepare to meet with God. No other gods, do not make any idols, do not take the name of the Lord in vain and remember the day set aside for worship. Bill Day, who also is an evangelism professor at the Seminary where I teach, shared this insight about the second commandment that is both insightful and worthy to be repeated: One way to apply that understanding could be something like this: God has called us to be a holy nation, a people set apart for Himself. To fulfill what God has called us to do, we must learn to have that time where we are set apart for Him each week. Keeping the Sabbath holy, or set apart, is a discipline and a focus more than it is a set of laws of what one can and cannot do on Sunday. These have been covered so well by so many, I will not attempt repeating the obvious. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one. Not only that, but we are not to allow anything to get in the way: Our prayer centers itself around the recognition of who God is and desiring all that is in heaven be realized here. The first part of the Model Prayer deals with our relationship with God. Since God has been full of grace and mercy to us, we need to be as He is to others. What is more, there are similarities and the experience of worship found in Isaiah 6. Perhaps the easiest way to see this is in the following chart: He calls them to the mountain and He calls the disciples to Himself. Secondly, God reveals Himself, His nature and character: Next is how we properly relate to who God is: When the prophet saw the greatness and holiness of God, he confessed his sin and was forgiven; that is, there was a restoration of relationship with God, as well as a the understanding of who we are related to who He is. If we are to be rightly related to God, we must recognize who He is and who we are and be in right relationship through confession and forgiveness. The last six commandments and the last part of the prayer help us have some handles of how to live our lives in a fallen culture, while still praying that things here would be as they are in heaven. God, from the very beginning of creation has desired a relationship with His creation. That relationship was not because God had a need, for as God, He has no needs. The relationship exists so that through His fellowship and the understanding of knowing who He is, we reflect praise and glory back to Him. Far from an egotistical tyrant that creates just to prove himself as powerful, we have a loving Father who takes the initiative to reveal Himself to His creation so that by knowing Him and seeing His glory they might see His greatness and be blessed and return that blessing in praise and adoration. God has desired this from Eden, through the Exodus, through the prophets of the Old Covenant, through the Sermon on the Mount, through Gethsemane, the empty tomb and the Great White Throne. My 13 year old has to memorize the 10 Commandments for the Lutheran Challenge. I was not looking forward to this - but your post made it so easy. She (and I) memorized all of them in about 20 minutes.

Thou shalt have no other gods before me. Thou shalt not make for thyself an idol. Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord in vain. Remember the Sabbath and keep it holy. Honor thy Father and Mother. Thou shalt not murder. Thou shalt not commit adultery. Thou shalt not steal. Thou shalt not bear false witness. Thou shalt not covet. In our modern world, these ten short phrases have created much controversy as the culture has distanced itself from God and any association with Him. Of course there are more than Ten Commandments God has given us through His word, but these ten laws are given to the culture. God promised Israel that if the nation kept these simple instructions, He would bless their nation. God took all the laws that were given and would be given and condensed them into easy to understand phrases that each person could comprehend and therefore evaluate their actions within these laws. God has also blessed every nation that has made these laws the foundation of their government and I believe will continue to do so. Unfortunately our nation has broken ranks with these governing laws and now seeks to bar their view from any public display within their control. In our New Testament age, the real application of these commands belongs to the church. Sometimes Christians get confused when they remove the New Testament foundation from their understanding of these commandments and try to put themselves under the Old Testament law. The cross of Jesus Christ is the lens by which everything in the scripture must be viewed. We cannot go back and try to put our lives under the Old Testament law, but we must submit ourselves to the New Testament commandments that are applied through the law of faith. Jesus said that He did not come to do away with the law but to fulfill the law and then offer Himself as a redemptive sacrifice for us. This is affirmed and explained in Romans 3: No, but by the law of faith. Is He not also the God of the Gentiles? Yes, of the Gentiles also, 30 since there is one God who will justify the circumcised by faith and the uncircumcised through faith. On the contrary, we establish the law. This passage provides a lot of information to digest. While we were in our sins, God had to remain just. Justice demands judgment against violations of the law; therefore, through the cross, God remained just and also became our justifier through faith in Jesus. Without violating justice, you and I were justified or declared to be just even though we violated the law of sin. We are declared just because Jesus kept the law yet paid the penalty of being a violator of the law and by faith, we receive the justification by receiving His righteousness as He has received credit for our sins 2 Corinthians 5: So you can see that the law was not done away with, but fulfilled in Christ. By the law of faith, we receive the justification of Christ as we put our trust in His sacrifice of offering Himself up for our violations of the law. The law has not been done away with; it has just been established in faith. Even though mankind could not fulfill the law because all have fallen short, all people can be justified by the law through faith in Christ. So even though the law has not changed, how the law is fulfilled has changed as justice passed through the cross of Jesus Christ. We now remain in the justification of the law through our fellowship with Jesus Christ. The Bible states that if we abide in the light of Jesus Christ, we have forgiveness of all sin, but if we walk in rebellion to Christ, we are not walking in righteousness but instead we are lying to ourselves and are violators of the law 1 John 1:

I determined at that moment to memorize the Ten Commandments. I thought it would be also be good for my children to memorize them as well. Now my dad was always a stickler for memorization. We were duly impressed. At least it does for my dad. But the most important thing that he did with these tools was to memorize the Bible. I must admit that I learned a thing or two from dear old Dad, and when I was in school I put some of his devices to use. As I crammed for tests I would try to invent ways to remember the required answers. When I decided it was time to memorize the Ten Commandments, I used this trusty old method. It worked for me and my kids. Soon we were all reciting them without any hesitation. I was so pleased that we picked it up so easily. I could share our little secret with them. The idea is to come up with a plan that will help you to recall the Ten Commandments in order. Do not worship any other gods besides me. This one is pretty simple. God Almighty is number one -- and there are no gods before Him! Do not make idols of any kind If God is number one, how can a graven image, or a copy, be number one? Inevitably it will be a "number two," because only God can be number one! So commandment number two is no idols. Do not misuse the name of the Lord your God. We call this the Trinity. Remember to observe the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. Jesus told his disciples, "The Sabbath was made for man, and not man for the Sabbath. It is a day of rest. In other words, worship and rest are what the Sabbath is there "for" -- so commandment number four is to remember the Sabbath and keep it holy. Honor your father and mother. Then you will live a long, full life in the land the Lord your God will give you. This commandment is the only one with a corresponding promise -- that your days will be long on the earth. So, if you honor your father and mother you will live a long life. We remember it by saying, number five "keeps you alive! Do not commit adultery. Lust is one of the "seven deadly sins" in the Roman Catholic catechism. So I remember commandment number seven -- adultery, which is a result of giving in to lust -- as one of the deadly sins that I should avoid. For this one I reminded my kids of the story of Aladdin, the thief of Baghdad. In the beginning of the story he steals a piece of bread and begins "eating" it. Suddenly, the police are upon him and he gets in trouble for what he "ate. Do not testify falsely against your neighbor. Now this one is a bit of a stretch, I will admit, and it reveals a little bit of my rock-and-roll roots. The rumor was that if you played this rather odd song backwards there was some sort of hidden message. So the allegation about number nine was a "false witness" -- get it? So something that is rated at ten is very nice. In our human nature we tend to covet what is very nice. The Greatest Commandment So there you have them. I hope this fun little tool will help you memorize the Ten Commandments and make them a central part of your life. Either way, take time to memorize these special verses of Scripture. Jesus taught that these commandments can be summed up as, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself" Luke
