It has been a penal colony for years. Today only a few convicts on part-time detection live here, working on renovating some buildings, growing olive oil trees, wheat and barley. It is not possible to sail close the coast, so the island is like a nursery for fish flora. It has been known since Roman Empire age when few noble families decided to spend here their vacation to rest and retreat. Today you find rest of these times in the archeological site of the island. Capraia Capraia takes its name from the wild goats that used to live here. It is the only volcano island of the Archipelago. Closer to Corse in France than to Italy, it strikes for the color of volcano rocks, i. You can still admire rest of Roman settlement and of an old penal colony. The few beaches are made up of rocks and you can dive off into green and crystal clear water. Gorgona Gorgona is the smallest of the seven islands of Tuscany. The island is mostly rocky, covered of Mediterranean scrub. Sailing around the island is forbidden, so the water is clear and unpolluted and deserves a bath.

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Music of Florence Tuscany has a rich ancient and modern musical tradition, and has produced numerous composers and musicians, including Giacomo Puccini and Pietro Mascagni. Florence is the main musical centre of Tuscany. The city was at the heart of much of the Western musical tradition. It was there that the Florentine Camerata convened in the mid-sixteenth century and experimented with setting tales of Greek mythology to music and staging, resulting in the first operas, fostering the further development of the operatic form, and the later developments of separate "classical" forms such as the symphony. There are numerous musical centres in Tuscany. Other important musical centres in Tuscany include Livorno, Pisa and Grosseto.

Literature[edit] Tuscan poet and literary figure Petrarch Several famous writers and poets are from Tuscany, most notably Florentine author Dante Alighieri. In Tuscany, especially in the Middle Ages, popular love poetry existed. A school of imitators of the Sicilians was led by Dante da Maiano, but its literary originality took another line – that of humorous and satirical poetry. The democratic form of government created a style of poetry which stood strongly against the medieval mystic and chivalrous style. Devout invocation of God or of a lady came from the cloister and the castle; in the streets of the cities everything that had gone before was treated with ridicule or biting sarcasm. Another type of poetry also began in Tuscany. He attempted political poetry, and although his work is often obscure, he prepared the way for the Bolognese school. Bologna was the city of science, and philosophical poetry appeared there. Guido Guinizelli was the poet after the new fashion of the art. In his work the ideas of chivalry are changed and enlarged. Only those whose heart is pure can be blessed with true love, regardless of class. He refuted the traditional credo of courtly love, for which love is a subtle philosophy only a few chosen knights and princesses could grasp. Love is blind to blasons but not to a good heart when it finds one: In the 13th century, there were several major allegorical poems. One of these is by Brunetto Latini, who was a close friend of Dante. His *Tesoretto* is a short poem, in seven-syllable verses, rhyming in couplets, in which the author professes to be lost in a wilderness and to meet with a lady, who represents Nature, from whom he receives much instruction. We see here the vision, the allegory, the instruction with a moral object, three elements which we shall find again in the *Divine Comedy*. The poems today are generally studied not as literature, but for historical context. A fourth allegorical work was the *Intelligenza*, which is sometimes attributed to Compagni, but is probably only a translation of French poems. In the 15th century, humanist and publisher Aldus Manutius published the Tuscan poets Petrarch and Dante Alighieri *Divine Comedy*, creating the model for what became a standard for modern Italian.

Cuisine[edit] An assortment of Tuscan foods from Lucca: Tuscan wine Simplicity is central to the Tuscan cuisine. Legumes, bread, cheese, vegetables, mushrooms and fresh fruit are used. Olive oil is made up of Moraiolo, Leccino and Frantoiano olives. White truffles from San Miniato appear in October and November. Beef of the highest quality comes from the Chiana Valley, specifically a breed known as Chianina used for Florentine steak. The indigenous Cinta Senese breed of pork is also produced.

For both of us, it will be a pleasant return to Elba Island, a place where we have already been with friends when we were younger, and that we still remember with pleasure for its amazingly clear water and for its lush nature. To reach this beach, I remember that from the church of the village we have to follow the main road, and once there, park the car in one of the free parking 60 meters away from the beach. Pomonte beach is a lovely tiny pebble beach with crystal clear water. Our suggestion is to arrive early in the morning to take place. I remember that, when I went there years ago, the East wind was blowing and some guys were surfing. I had also memories of an intense moment admiring the sunset facing the outline of the Corsica, the biggest French island, at the horizon. Nestled in a small natural cove, Fetovaia is a golden sandy beach with watercolors that go between turquoise and sapphire. It is possible to add at the moments of relaxation at the beach, with excursions in paddleboats, or with walks along the long promontory surrounded by the wild Mediterranean scrub. If you are traveling with kids, this beach is perfect because the water is shallow and calm the sea is rough only if southern winds as Libeccio or Sirocco are blowing , so you do not have to be worried about them while they are playing in the water. The beach has facilities as bar and restaurant, paddleboards rental, and is pet-friendly too. The only inconvenient is that especially in July and August, it is one of the most crowded beaches of the Elba Island, but once plunged in this marvelous water, I am sure you will forget about it. Things to do on the Elba Island: Walking into the history of Elba Island 3. Visit the Fortress of Volterraio Being fascinated by castles and legend of knights and old families, for sure we will visit the Fortress of Volterraio. In , Pisa decided to use the fortress for defensive reasons investing enormous resources for its expansion. Thanks to this important reinforcement, the Turkish pirates never conquered the castle during their several incursions on the Elba Island. He used to rest here in the coolest hours of the day, and often he enjoyed the company of noble ladies and peasants of the gentle sex. He wanted this two-storey villa with a sober architecture as his summer residence, and his sister Paolina lent him the money to buy it. Napoleon Bonaparte lived here in exile for only nine months, from the 4 May to the 26 February He was entitled Prince and the Elba Island became for its first time the center of European political affairs. He invested money in modernizing the island, financing the construction of a road system, introducing administrative decrees and sustaining the rise of the industries. At the entrance of the villa, the statue of Galatea welcomes the visitor. The Italian artist Canova made this masterpiece choosing Mrs. Paolina Bonaparte Borghese as a model. Inside the Egyptian room, it is also possible to admire an octagonal basin containing papyrus plants. In the room of the Love Knot, used at that time as a dining room, look up to the ceiling and appreciate the beautiful frescos representing the love between Napoleon and Marie Louise, symbolized by two doves flying away that are tying a knot of love. We will also have a look at the Demidoff Gallery. In , the Russian prince Anatolio Demidoff, husband of Matilde of Monfort, Napoleon nephew, decided to buy the villa. He financed the building of a gallery to conserve his astounding Napoleonic gallery, and to satisfy his pleasure as an art collector. It hosted also another famous sculpture as the Paolina Bath with the well-known marble bathtub, the imperial library and other decorations representing the Egyptian campaign. Unfortunately, this first real Napoleonic museum of the world was closed at the death of Anatolio in , and all the collection was sold. From the gallery is used as an exhibition space housing several prints of the Napoleonic Era coming from many private collections, and temporary historical exhibits. Villa San Martino 5. It takes his name from the several Mulini windmills settled here in the olden days. The choice of

using this villa as his preferred residence was that the place had a strategic overlooking position above the town and the sea. From the panoramic terrace, he could observe the boats entering the port, and even admire a wonderful landscape. During his stay, Napoleon recreated few times the splendor of his French court, to host his mother and his sister Paolina that, otherwise they would never have come to Elba. Nowadays the villa houses memorabilia and furniture of the Napoleonic Era, and the library that Napoleon brought with him during his exile including some precious Voltaire, La Fontaine, and Plutarco, and that he donated to the town of Portoferraio.
