

Chapter 1 : Sex ed for Christians | Think Christian

We should also discuss it openly - without shame or too much embarrassment - in the home. This way, our kids can develop a solid theology of sex for themselves, a theology that recognizes sex as a good thing - a gift from God - and a theology immersed in grace. Sex - and our understanding of it - is never beyond redemption. This theology, as well as a broad understanding of and compassion for other sexual views, will allow our kids to be lights in this dark world. Instead, they need to understand the way all sorts of people from all sorts of backgrounds and cultures and religions view sex so that they can be beacons of compassion, of empathy, of understanding, of love in what is, without a doubt, a sex-abusing, sex-confused world. We need to understand other views of sex if we want to engage in a Christ-like manner. From my take, He sought to understand. To love first and go from there. We will have to admit we may not have all the answers.

Chapter 2 : What does the Bible say about oral sex?

Most knowledgeable and spiritually mature Christians realize that God is the author of sex and love, and every part and sensation of the human body, and that He intended the relationship between husband and wife to be loving, sensuous, joyful, creative and full of pleasure.

Is oral sex biblically wrong within marriage? Our question is in the area of oral sex. Is it scripturally wrong for married couples? There is no biblical evidence that it is a sin against God for a husband and wife to express love for each other in this way. Even the book of Leviticus, which mentions many Old Testament sex-related prohibitions and rules for the Israelites, never mentions it. We are aware that some have tried to make a biblical issue out of what parts of the body a married couple can and cannot kiss. In their minds, there is only one biblical form of sexual expression in marriage, sexual intercourse. They attempt to defend their viewpoint on biblical grounds—trying to make it into a holiness issue. However, nowhere do we see Scripture putting such limits on the sexual relationship of a godly husband and wife, even Levitical priests who were forbidden to do many things. Most knowledgeable and spiritually mature Christians realize that God is the author of sex and love, and every part and sensation of the human body, and that He intended the relationship between husband and wife to be loving, sensuous, joyful, creative and full of pleasure. Using delicate, romantic language and metaphors, it describes a beautiful, affectionate, romantic, sensuous, joyful and passionate love between husband and wife. One cannot be sure what this means exactly, but certainly we see no evidence here or elsewhere that God is concerned with what part of their bodies might be touching, including where they kissed their mate. He wants all Christians, including husbands and wives, to be kind to each other, patient, respectful and unselfish. Ultimate love is pure in motive and action. Follow that goal, and you are not likely to go wrong. Perhaps you have heard some one claim that oral lovemaking in marriage is wrong by associating it with the ancient cities of Sodom and Gomorrah. This comparison is misguided and offensive. To the contrary, there was a total lack of godly, loving, heterosexual marriage partners in Sodom save Lot and his wife. We shall not name the many gross and demonically inspired evils that probably took place among the wicked there. It is better left unsaid. Suffice it to say that the list would sicken most people. Serious students of the Bible and archaeology know that the kind of things that were going on at Sodom were done by extremely ungodly people, expressing enormous selfishness, total lack of love, extreme spiritual depravity, and major rebellion against God. In other words, the sex lives of godly husbands and wives was not an issue at these cities, nor did it have anything to do with its destruction. Although the Bible is silent on the specifics of what you have asked apparently leaving it up to the mutual agreement of the marriage partners, it is not silent on sex in marriage. Conservative Christian marriage counselors Dr. Each has not only the freedom but also the responsibility to please the other and to be pleased in return.

I want the message my sexuality communicates to be worthy of You: Lord Jesus, I invite You now to do in my life what it takes for You to be pre-eminent in my sex life. Not some romance book. And everything You make is good. There are many ways sex has been perverted over time and in our culture. There are many wrong ways to use, misuse, and abuse sex. These sinful distortions of sex sear the heart and can affect how I perceive sex. But because You created sex as good, I will not reject it as bad, dirty, or ungodly. I will not reject it as taboo or see it as duty but will receive it as a gift to both give and receive. Take the truth of Your word and shape my belief system regarding sex around it. Do something I cannot do, Lord. I commit afresh to praying Your word over my sex life, believing that it will be sanctified in practice as I ponder and receive Your truth. Rewrite my sex script to line up with Your word which says sex is holy, good, and the marriage bed undefiled. My sex life can bring You great glory. Lord, give me a vision for what that looks like. I know what fleshly passion looks like; now give me a vision of what sexual passion and intimacy that honors You looks like. For Your honor I ask this, amen! Sexual shame was not Your original intent; sin is what ushered in shame. Yet even in that, You have provided a covering for sin and the removal of shame. Lord, I can have such deep feelings of shame in this area of sex but I thank You for the covering You have provided for me. Just as You killed an animal to cover the nakedness- the exposure, vulnerability, and shame- of Adam and Eve after their sin, You have provided the perfect, spotless Lamb to cover me. Even as I confess to You my sin and shame, I receive the covering You have given in Your love and kindness. Thank You for Jesus! You desire holiness in my sexuality and I do too. My body, mind, and emotions are Yours, Lord. As such, I desire to present the members of my body and mind to You, as instruments of righteousness, not as instruments of sin. Help me to honor You in and through my body. I desire to be a vessel of grace to him. I desire to be a loving doe and fruitful vine. And when fear at these very words enter my heart, I choose to trust that fear is not from You for You have not given me a spirit of fear but of Love, power, and a sound mind even in regards to the gift of sex. Our minds are so involved in our sexuality and sexual behavior! I desire my thought life in regards to sex to be full of things that are true, lovely, and of good report. And even as I ask this, I see how woefully short I fall in my thinking. How vision-less I tend to be when it comes to sex. How lacking I am in praise worthy things regarding sex. So please full up my mind with good fuel when it comes to sex. Help me be cognizant of TRUE things, good things, excellent, lovely, and pure things. Bring to mind the remembrance of these things, Lord and be glorified as my thinking changes to reflect sexual thoughts that honor You. Thank You God for the gift of sex. Chapter 4 : For the Christian Marriage Bed {7 Tips for a Better Sex Life}

Is oral sex a sin if done before or outside of marriage? This question is becoming increasingly common as young people are told that "oral sex is not really sex," and as oral sex is promoted as a safer (no risk of pregnancy, less risk of sexually transmitted diseases) alternative to sexual intercourse.*

Is oral sex OK for Christians? A quick Google search on this question online is likely to yield a plethora of responses, but for popular theologian and Baptist preacher John Piper, the answer to that question should depend on a number of factors. In a recent discussion of the question on the th episode of Ask Pastor John , the first consideration that comes into play when answering this question says Piper is that oral sex should be done within the confines of marriage. And we know this because even married couples are wondering if they should go there. It is as if it is a stage of intimacy that may not even be proper for married people," explained Piper. He then listed four reasons why oral sex would be wrong in a marriage and expounded on each reason. He noted that oral sex would be wrong if: Concerning biblical guidance on the subject, Piper said there is nothing in the Bible that prohibits oral sex. If the Bible pro-scribes it, it would have to be by principle and not by an explicit command. He then debated whether or not oral sex is unnatural and citing Proverbs 5: Well, might there be similar desires for oral sex or other kinds of sex? So I doubt that we should put a limit on a married couple based on the claim of it being unnatural. That is risky, but that is where I come down on the naturalness of it," said Piper. In discussing the healthfulness of the practice, Piper said oral sex can be unhealthy in the presence of sexually transmitted diseases and it can be carried out in harmful ways. In considering whether or not the activity is unkind, Piper discussed the idea of spouses pressuring each other to engage in oral sex when one party finds it unpleasant as an unkind gesture. Be kind to one another. But the key word here is pressure," said Piper. Likewise, the husband does not have authority over his own body, but the wife does. And the context there is sex. So what does that mean practically? I would like to blank. And both of them have the right to say: I would rather not blank.
