This letter reflects a traumatized community who has lost everything: How does one go on after such a devastating disaster? It speaks of the desire to pick up the pieces of their lives and to start living again. The focus in verses thus is on a range of activities that signal a return to some kind of normalcy -- such as building houses, planting vineyards, celebrating weddings -- and serves as a powerful testimony to resilience. These ordinary activities express the basic yearning for being safe and secure in the comfort of your own home, having enough food to eat and wine to gladden your heart, as expressed in Ecclesiastes 9: It also reflects a return of joy as evident in the reference to wedding celebrations that express hope for the future through shared food, wine, and community. To build a life. They are also advised to actively work for the wellbeing or peace of their newly adopted city -- even praying to God for the city to prosper. As immigrant communities throughout the ages know all too well, if the city prospers, it might just go well with them as well. Except if it does not. The letter of Jeremiah thus serves also as a warning to immigrants in which they are urged to acquiesce, to fit in to the dominant culture, to avoid bringing attention to themselves. In this sense, the letter of Jeremiah may be considered as a piece of propaganda that serves the interests of the Empire to foster peace and quiet and squelch any possibility of resistance. The potentially harmful effects of such an interpretation should be kept in mind particularly in our current context in which immigrants all over the world are struggling to survive, and perhaps hopefully also to thrive, in the cities and towns in which they find themselves. The God-human relationship is further evident in the people searching for God in Jeremiah. A final theme in this text is the reference to the true versus false prophets that also is the focus of the previous chapter, which outlines the battle between Jeremiah and Hananiah regarding who can claim to truly speak the word of God. Even when they, like Hananiah before them, say that it is God who is sending them, do not believe what they say for they are lying, according to Jeremiah. In contrast, Jeremiah proclaims exactly the opposite message by stating that the exile would be very long indeed. For the current exiles, 70 years most definitely meant all of their lives, and probably also for the next generation. Many of us today may encounter situations that cannot be changed, no matter how much we would have wanted things to be different. The question then is how one, amidst such difficult circumstances, can live the best possible life, including daily practices that make life both possible and meaningful. Perhaps even more important than figuring out how to live amidst these less-than-perfect circumstances is the question of how one manages to find joy while being in exile. Restore us, and let us find you when we seek you.

You love Jesus, yet you feel isolated from the church – and even shunned by it. But now, it does: I, Peter, am an apostle on assignment by Jesus, the Messiah, writing to exiles scattered to the four winds. Not one is missing, not one forgotten. God the Father has his eye on each of you, and has determined by the work of the Spirit to keep you obedient through the sacrifice of Jesus. May everything good from God be yours! But now, you do. In the Old Testament, it was. The Lord himself said as much: And the nations will know that the people of Israel went into exile for their sin, because they were unfaithful to me. So I hid my face from them and handed them over to their enemies Ezek. Yet as Hebrews 11 shows, people of faith throughout time have experienced a different type exile – an exile that results from their believing and following the Lord. It may be physical, but it is, foremost, social and spiritual. All these [ancient people of faith, including Abel, Enoch, Noah, Abraham, Sarah, Isaac and Jacob] died in faith, – having confessed that they were strangers and exiles on the earth. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God Heb. Peter wrote to exiles shunned by people for following God. The apostle John experienced this kind of exile. In fact, he wrote Revelation while living in exile. Introducing himself in Revelation 1: I, John, your brother and companion in the suffering and kingdom and patient endurance that are ours in Jesus, was on the island of Patmos because of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus. If the world hates you, keep in mind that it hated me first. If you belonged to the world, it would love you as its own. As it is, you do not belong to the world, but I have chosen you out of the world. That is why the world hates you John They will put you out of the synagogue John Hatred and shunning go hand-in-hand. Maybe, rather, you feel isolated from the church and even shunned by it. That may cause you deep pain, bewilderment, distress. Take a deep breath, and consider again what Jesus said in John Exactly who hated Jesus? If we read the Gospels with that question in mind, the answer is both clear and stunning. As Jesus died in their behalf, disciples, crowds and government leaders chose against sharing in his sufferings. The outcasts loved that he saw them, included them and treated them with respect. The disciples left everything to follow him. Only the religious leaders hated him with a vicious, determined-to-get-rid-of-him hate. They were the leaders entrusted with representing the one true God. They were the ones most fully prepped by God himself to recognize and welcome his Son. The very next day, the hatred of the religious leaders would lead to his crucifixion. Ravaged by the wolves Yet Jesus and Paul both warned that, in future, the biggest threat to following God would come from the least expected place of all, from within the church. Some of your own people will distort the word in order to lure followers after them. Wolves would arise among those entrusted to represent the Lord Jesus. But they would not look ferocious. They would look like gentle shepherds, harmless sheep. These deceiver-wolves would mislead many. Shrewdly, they would attack and run off any who saw the truth and tried to sound an alarm. Jesus and Paul foresaw clearly. Christian history is filled with accounts of the persecution of the faithful by people supposed to be leading them. Church systems with some form of government-sanctioned privilege or power have often spawned the greatest cruelty. Kept by God If any of this hits home with you, be encouraged: May grace and peace be yours in the fullest measure.

The first synagogue to be built in this place was the Alsheikh synagogue, in which was housed the returnees most prized possessions: Torah scrolls and old, handwritten manuscripts. When these who had ridden upon donkeys were spied by the gentiles, they were presently envied by the gentiles, who then went unto the king and pressed upon him to outlaw their riding upon donkeys, saying that this mode of transportation seemed to be too extravagant for the Jews and would lead to a general unrest and eventual hegemony over the indigenous people. The king then passed a series of discriminatory laws. Jews were to pass only on the left side of all Muslims. They also petitioned the king that a Jew would be prohibited by an edict from raising his voice against any Muslim, but to behave in a lowly and contrite spirit, and that offenders would be made punishable by flogging. Neither had there remained any of them, save ten people for every hundred [who were driven out into exile], while the majority of them did not return to settle in their former place, but were scattered in all the districts of Yemen. That is, aside from the family of the Levites, most of whom returned and settled in their [former] place. These trace their lineage to Sasson the Levite, their ancestor, seeing that there was a law for the early Jews in Yemen for each family to dwell separately; the family of priests Cohenim by themselves with their burial grounds, and also the family of Levites and the Israelites, each of them dwelling by themselves in their cities and with their own burial grounds. Now, unto this day, those Levites dwell separately in those said districts, although a few Israelites have newly arrived to dwell in their midst. In every place, the gentiles have given to them a parcel of ground, on a rental basis, in order that they may construct shelters in which to live, set apart from them, seeing that their enemies had already taken [from them] their own towns and houses and vineyards and fields. Thus, they were pleased to dwell with them and to be occupied in the various fields of labour, according to their diverse skills, in order that they might find sustenance thereby for their beings: Now their magnanimity did not permit them to just lay back in idleness. Muhammad, in the year A. However, there were some who managed to sell their house; what was worth one-thousand gold pieces they sold for one-hundred, and what was worth one-hundred gold pieces they sold for ten. So that, by these things, we were for a reproach amongst the nations, who continuously sought after ways by which they might cause us to change [our religion], O may God forbid! And if one had need of going out into the marketplace, he could not avoid being the object of hatred and spite, while there were those who even attacked him or called him by abusive language, so that there was fulfilled in this, our generation, the scripture that says, Who will raise up Jacob, for he is too small Amos 7: So, too, was there fulfilled in us by reason of our iniquities the scripture that says, And I shall send a faintness into their hearts Lev. Yet, the divine Name, blessed be He, gives us strength to bear all those troubles and travails each day. It is sung without the accompaniment of musical instruments, although a tin drum is sometimes used, in accordance with what is customary and proper for the nashid a rejoinder. His own name is spelt out in acrostic form in the first letters of each stanza: They have forgotten what pertains to their happiness, and have also been diminished. The sun and the moon were extinguished at their departure! So that they have inherited all of the glory, even their sublime honour! Midrash, as also the Talmud and the Torah, they have abolished. Orion and Pleiades, as well as the crescent moon, have become dim! The beauty of their homes and their money they had entirely looted. The rhyme, however, has been lost in the translation: Harken to these matters, and let not your mind be distracted, for the appointed time is at hand. Al-Mahdi the king has decreed over us that we take flight. As for the young ones and those who were weak, their tears flowed like riverine brooks. Go out to the gate of the city to welcome them! Now is the hour of testing those

who are friends. Let them take pleasure in the weary fugitive, so that his fatigue might depart from him. They are the sons of the tribes and of those who are pious; those who are highborn and of gentility. If its light flickers, it is about to change. I am curtailed of my sleep from dismay, while tears run down my cheeks. Happy is he who returns safely from that place. We have already sold our fields, have forsaken our houses, and have submitted to the decree of our lord, [the king]. Consider, O Lord, and reflect upon how many distinguished men, as well as those who were delicately raised, have been humiliated! Weep, O Rachel, in our city for [your] wandering sons! We shall then hear the song of the sons of Heman i. Let him then take away the poison of the adder, which is most bitter. Let him command Yinnon i. Elijah, the forerunner of the Messiah , and let him say to him: And by the nut tree garden may you sedate my heart which is in pain. As for Gabriel and the rooster, I have heard them in the street, whilst my pigeon is at rest; she calls out to the poor: We shall then behold the house of our God, and the houses of Gischala Heb. The Mashtaite [57] has said: O God, remove mine affliction. Our strength is brought low in Yemen, in the days of my exile. In both small and great matters, I think about my case. Now, by the abundance [of afflictions] delights have been diminished. He who instructs my tongue to speak, Heaven forbid that you have forgotten me! Unto Whom belong signs and wonders. Behold, it was upon us that He bestowed His bounty, and He has chosen Moses, the son of Amram, our beloved prophet! The pampered pigeons are cooing in the tops of the citadels. The Book of the Law i. Torah calls out to all wise men, and says: It is the reason for their ignorance. Let them repent before the masters and return unto their Lord. The day of redemption is nigh, and He shall gather together their dispersed. There is a time for drinking wine, together with [eating] dainties, and there is a time for delving in wisdom. He, whose wine makes him heavy laden, let him sleep [and rest] from his weariness and from his burden. Let him wake-up to drink a second cup, such as may be imposed upon him. In conclusion, [let us pray] that He who is congenial i. God might conceal us in the covert of His mercy. The Benevolent One shall not forget us, while we shall proclaim the eminence of His bountiful grace. He that will console us, may he be merited with a good life. He that gives to us clothing, may his own wishes be fulfilled. My salutations go out unto those of my companions on this happy, but powerful night; [which shall continue unabated] until Venus comes out [in the sky]. That which my God has decreed shall come to pass, while for every thing there is a reason. The birds will once again trill at the top of the ben [nut] tree *Moringa peregrina* in the fruitful orchard. He has revealed his ill-intentions on a dark night, one made sullen by the shadow of death; and who has sent against us soldiers and oppressors. We lifted up our voices unto God of heaven, [saying]: You are He that governs all! There is none who takes an interest in our case, nor anyone who will take pity upon us. On the day in which he took them out of their houses, their eyes rained tears of blood. They had gone out a short distance in the dark of night. I have no pleasure in sleep, nor in bread or water! Praised be the Creator of the heavenly circuits, the Ruler of all [things], unto whom none can be compared. Your covenant and your signs have been forever. You have intoxicated your people with the waters of Abraham, [made during] the covenant between the dissected halves. No one tries to help us, nor is there anyone who takes pity upon us. They have humiliated our religion, and have called out to us to become Muslims; even to sin and to desecrate your Divine Law. Our elders have gone forth into exile by an urgent command, whether willingly or unwillingly. I have concluded my words, my brethren! Take-up my salutations and remain silent! Our hope is in God the Omniscient. Do not forget Isaac, your bound [servant], on the day in which he spoke to Abraham face to face. Praise be to you, O Master of the universe! Later, he made a written account of the same in his momentous ethnographic work, *Iben Safir*. Many of them died along the way, while those who came there could not bear the climate of that place and its infirmities. Two thirds of them succumbed and perished, and they had entertained the notion that all of them would perish either by the plague, by famine or by thirst, may God forbid. *Saphir* brings down a poem written about the event by Rabbi Shalom Shabazi , and which has already been quoted above Now during the time of this exile and perdition, they had lost all of their precious belongings, and their handwritten books, as well as their peculiar compositions which they possessed of old. Notwithstanding, it is by the mercies of the Lord that we have not perished.

God moved me from Washington DC to rural Appalachian NY in the summer last year. I thought it was to go to school and learn to be a social worker I left a near 30 year career in consulting in DC but nope, it is not to be a social worker it is to bring peace and prosperity to rural Appalachian NY! I watched the first one over and over and sat and cried out of relief and joy because it was such a gift to me to finally see how it all fit together and what I was being called to! I saw how Government programs support existing levels of poverty they do not change it. They enslave people more than they free people. They are essential to keeping people afloat but how do we get them to have their dignity back, to be able to do more, to have more to take care of themselves and build their community? There are people who had a roof collapse and had to sell the copper pipes out of their house just to live. How can this be? It has contributed to major change in my church. They were in the process of reviewing things and now some foreign missions funds are being rediverted to local needs. It is helping my little country church see its own destiny within its community and the people are coming out into the community. People who have not been to church in decades, who are broken hearted and wounded in spirit, are coming to our little church. They are coming back to church and being restored in their faith and walk with God. I am starting a non-profit: I work with non-profits, faith based, civic non-government and government agencies to build their understanding that basically, we have to do economic development together for the life of our local community or it will die. I was just some crazy middle aged woman from DC wandering around in cowboy boots asking questions and wondering why nobody was doing anything. Now I get it. The work is hard and daunting. We are making changes for the good. I keep watching it to keep my courage up. I still doubt my own sanity daily, but the videos and the Field Guide help me keep going. This is just the beginning. I know it is. Their minds have been blown! We have hard work ahead, for the life of the world. And thank you for being part of our story. It touches my heart so much to know we are connected in our mission. Your work is enabling our work and changing the life of the world in a little overlooked rural Appalachian New York where the poverty is so bad that even the Red Cross pulled out of our county this year.

Exiles was created after a period of development aimed at creating a new What If? Tony Bedard took over, writing roughly half the series, from Chris Claremont came onboard as of issue 90 and ended the series with the crossover X-Men Die by the Sword, before restarting the series as New Exiles. New Exiles ran for 18 issues before being canceled. A few months later the series was restarted again with a second volume of Exiles, written by Jeff Parker. This relaunch only lasted 6 issues before being canceled as well. Fictional team biography[edit] Main article: The team has since gone through a multitude of line-ups with Morph and Blink remaining the only original Exiles. Art by Mike McKone. This cover features the original roster. Tallus[edit] Initially, the Exiles are employed by the Timebroker to fix broken realities. The Tallus is a communications device, which is worn by the leader of the group in order to communicate with the Timebroker. Through it, he would assign missions to the team and inform them of any changes, etc. Blink wears the Tallus in the beginning, but it is later transferred to Sabretooth when Blink rebels against the Timebroker. It is now used as a means of communication between its wearer and whomever is operating the Crystal Palace on various missions. It has a slightly different appearance for each wearer. For the first time ever, Sabretooth has used the Tallus to transport himself back to the Crystal Palace, without anyone on the other side recalling him. Sasquatch Heather Hudson arrives when Thunderbird becomes comatose during a battle with the world-eating Galactus. The two teams join forces to rescue a group of children from a Sentinel prison camp. However, the teams are told the second stage of the mission is to kill one of the children – David Richards son of Rachel Summers and Franklin Richards – who will apparently grow up to become a powerful supervillain. Weapon X is willing to kill him, but the Exiles are not and the two teams fight until the Timebroker intervenes. Sabretooth of the Weapon X team agrees to stay behind and raise David Richards himself. The Timebroker sends Blink home after a visit to a world plagued by a variant of the Legacy Virus , since the team had repaired her personal broken chain in time [7] and Magik Illyana Rasputin takes her place. Mimic then replaces Blink as leader, gaining the Tallus. During the next mission, [11] the Exiles and Weapon X are forced to battle each other until only six remain alive. Magik is killed by King Hyperion when she attempts to switch sides and betray the Exiles. King Hyperion is eventually defeated by Blink, who teleports his own heat vision into his back, paralyzing him. Gambit of Weapon X is allowed to deliver the killing blow against King Hyperion with a kinetically charged sword of the slain Magik which causes an explosion that kills them both, leaving five Exiles alive and their mission complete. The Exiles visit the main Marvel Universe for a second time [12] where they are joined by Namora , who replaces Magik, and are instructed to "leave their possessions and earn their wings". Reed Richards deduces this means they are to leave Nocturne behind whose power involves possession and have Beak join the Exiles, which is confirmed by the Timebroker. Timebrokers[edit] The team is told by The Celestials to "beware the Timebreaker [sic], he is not what he seems". Heather Hudson is removed from the team [14] without explanation and replaced with former Weapon X member Sabretooth. The Tallus orders the Exiles to kill Mimic and despite their refusal, they are allowed to move onto a new mission normally a mission must be completed for the Exiles to move on. Next, the Timebroker replaces Beak with Holocaust , [15] which they are informed is a punishment for disobeying previous orders. Eventually, the Exiles break free of the Timebroker and stage a raid on Panoptichron also known as the "Crystal Palace" , home of the Timebroker and a location from which many parallel universes can be monitored. Here they discover that the Timebroker is an alien race of bug-like beings that found the Panoptichron and accidentally broke a series of timelines. Lacking the power to repair the timelines, they concocted this scheme of recruiting heroes from various worlds to do their work for them. Not only that, all previously "returned" heroes are actually in Panoptichron, frozen in blocks, along with the killed heroes. As a final twist, the evil King Hyperion has fully regenerated from being blown up by Gambit, broken free of his

stasis and has taken over Panoptichron. The Exiles are nearly defeated with both Namora and Holocaust dying in the battle. Beak returns from stasis and saves the day by calling on two good versions of Hyperion for help, fulfilling his destiny as an Exile. King Hyperion is subdued and exiled to his home reality which is completely devoid of life. Unfortunately, Earth is dominated by the House of M. During their stay, the Exiles run afoul of the body-hopping serial killer Proteus , who steals data from the Panoptichron and escapes from Earth , leaving Beak depowered back home. During the "World Tour" of hunting down Proteus, Mimic is possessed by Proteus and dies, forcing the Exiles to pick up new members Longshot , Spider-Man , and Power Princess to restore their diminished numbers. Post-World Tour[edit] The Exiles begin cleaning out the stasis gallery of former Exiles and Weapon X members and send them back home. Iron Man , Daredevil , and Angel are sent back to their respective realities alive, while every other Earth with a missing superhuman holds a funeral. Blink, at the suggestion of Power Princess , takes Mimic home to be buried with his X-Men instead of burying him in Panoptichron. Spider-Man , Sabretooth, and Heather Hudson all decide to visit their home realities. However, after using several squads of Wolverines to complete the next mission and failing, Logan from Days of Future Past and young James Howlett convince the Timebreakers that the Exiles are needed. After the "classic Exiles" fight "the all-new Exiles" as Morph put it , it is later revealed that the whole thing was a scheme orchestrated by the Grandmaster , who seeks revenge on the Exiles for freeing Professor X on their first mission and ruining a bet. The Exiles, past and present, join forces with the Wrecking Crew of that Earth to defeat the Grandmaster. The current team then leaves the Earth in the hands of the approximation Exiles. The Exiles then take three weeks to save a chain of cracked realities, injuring Blink, Morph, and Spider-Man. Meanwhile, former Exile Thunderbird , is in the stasis gallery, dreaming of what might have been had he not become comatose. Enter Psylocke[edit] Power Princess leaves the team to return to the Squadron Supreme and Psylocke is brought on board to replace her. They are sent to kill Reed Richards. The Exiles are still there so they can help Psylocke recover from wounds inflicted by Wolverine , and to help rebuild the planet. After the Exiles return to Panoptichron, they find it empty, with no equipment, Timebreakers, or Heather. Blink and Morph eventually visit Heather, who thought the Exiles were dead and left Panoptichron. Heather is now pregnant and out of commission, so Psylocke stays behind to learn more about the Panoptichron while the other Exiles resume their missions. There she experiences visions which warn her of something bad to come, and an alternate version of Kitty Pryde appears from nowhere with no warning. The Exiles go to a seemingly perfect world led by Victor Von Doom but when Blink is caught by Reed Richards she begins to discover what hides behind this facade. In reality, she was assigned to get close to him so Doom could copy the Tally, which he does. He then sends a team of soldiers to Panoptichron. They take out Psylocke and assume Kitty Pryde is a freaked out child, though she appears to be faking that. The soldiers are attacked by Thunderbird , who is no longer comatose. As a result the Exiles are scattered to various dimensions, [30] much like Union Jack had done previously. Spider-Man finds a girlfriend and stays on the world on which he landed. Longshot, once again, got lucky and landed in the Crystal Palace after the transport went wrong. Die by the Sword[edit] Main article: While Betsy tries to care for her brother everybody else tries to fight, even Dazzler and Pete Wisdom , who were about to have sex, but, realizing they cannot win they teleport to the Panoptichron. TJ happily reunites with her former teammates while Sage is deemed the best option to care for Brian. Meanwhile Cat, using the scanner, realizes that Roma and Saturnyne are in trouble. Sage, Psylocke, and Wisdom recruit Albion to their cause, who proves to be a match for James Jaspers until Jaspers turns into the Fury. Merlyn then comes to his daughter to finish the job [35] only to be beaten by Psylocke. Saturnyne then promises to free Albion from jail to lead the Corps while Sage and TJ switch teams with Longshot who now remembers the highlights of his past. Exiles [edit] In Exiles Blink, Nocturne, and Thunderbird decide to leave the team because they are physically and emotionally exhausted and need a break. Sage struggles with her new knowledge gained from Roma and accidentally fights the other Exiles. Cat and Rogue explore the palace and almost die in a bungee-jumping accident, prompting Rogue to reveal flying powers. In the one-shot Exiles: Days of Then and Now, Blink discovers an Earth they were supposed to save, but did not because they were chasing Proteus during the World Tour. Finally, he ends up in the Age of Apocalypse where he saves Wild Child. Their mission was eventually revealed to them and they left the Earth despite the fact that the Panther

had taken control of it. Sage regains her telepathic powers, as they defend a man who has fallen in love with a dragon. After some fighting, the parents eventually surrender against true love and the dragon becomes human, while the Exiles are brought back to the Panoptichron, where Cat reveals that Gambit was listed as a member even before he was recruited. In the meantime, Hydra recruits a Wolverine-like man to her cause. However, she and Sabretooth face off against Empress Hydra after she locks them alone in a particular reality. Cat kills Wolverine [40] by removing his claws and slashing him with them. The Exiles then enjoy a quick break in the Panoptichron, where Morph gives Rogue a new costume and Psylocke deals with her fear of Slaymaster.
