Thank you for doing your part by shopping indie wherever you live and travel! I did not assign myself reading and generally picked up books at random, as I still do except for reading circle choices. My only rule was that I had to read the entire book: Now my old lists are a bit like old diaries, because I remember in glancing at the titles where I was at home, away for the winter, on vacation in the U. It was too embarrassing "not only as a reader, but as a bookseller" to be forever fumbling around when asked what I had recently read and enjoyed. And many of the stories were a timely reminder that truly nothing is new under the sun. For instance, back in the early days of American organized sports "the first local baseball teams or a sculling race on the river" there was no end of gambling and cheating and rigging and fixing and thieving. Also, a big sporting event "perhaps between two champions who had agreed ahead of time which way to throw the match and split the difference" would bring crowds of spectators to town, straining accommodations and raising prices for those grumbling locals who would make no money from the inconvenience. Reading Grandfather Stories was such a delightful escape from the 21st century that as soon as I finished it I passed it along to a friend recovering from surgery. Each taking several parts except for the star of the performance, we read Saint Joan aloud when our reading circle met the first Wednesday of November. Reading an entire work aloud, even a drama without long, descriptive paragraphs, took much more time than we usually spend discussing a novel say, hours, and it was almost midnight when I got home, but we all agreed it had been a worthwhile and pleasurable evening. A Love Story with Recipes let me slip back to France for a couple of evenings, a trip I always enjoy making. Sobering reading, that was. Twenty Lessons from the Twentieth Century, by Timothy Snyder, is rather a paradox, short and sweet while managing to be deep at the same time. The price is so modest that you can buy it, read it in an evening, and pass it along to a friend the next day. While Leelanau County coastal villages are no longer dependent on fishing, they are still quite dependent on tourism, as were the two villages on the French island. Then came River of Sand, by James Still. What a lovely, lovely book! Set in the Appalachian hills where the author grew up, this novel of a poor family moving back and forth between starvation farming and insecure coal mining is one you might expect to be depressing, but somehow, despite the poverty and hardships, it was not at all. Also, the enduring closeness of the family and its individuals gave warmth to the bleakest episodes. The flat fruit of the locust fell, lying like curved blades in the grass. August ripened the sedge clumps. Father began to come home from the mines in middle afternoon, no longer trudging the creek road at the edge of dark with a carbide lamp burning on his cap. He came now before the guineas settled to roost in the black birch. We watched the elder thicket at the hill turn and plunged down to meet him as he came into sight. The heifer ran after us. His people lived and died without electricity and usually without medical care, but were their lives worse for that? Once a reader accepts the impossible premise, that of Greek gods granting human intelligence to an assortment of dogs in a veterinary clinic, the rest of the story feels quite realistic. It offers nothing saccharine, nothing cute. If you want cuddly puppy stories, look elsewhere. A good book on horse training is something I can never resist, and this one more than lived up to the words in a foreword by someone who had interviewed the author: This is not a book for skimming. You may wake up a better horseman, and a better person. On the second page, the author writes about a Sunday afternoon drive in the family car when he was just a kid, when out there in the country appeared a ranch with horses in the pasture. All my short life I had loved horses. After all, I had never actually been around real horses. But like so many other boys and girls my age, I just was. But back to the book! In so many current books on training either dogs or horses, the basic assumption underlying all else is

that the owner or rider must be the alpha, the dog or horse submissive. In observing herds of horses interacting, however, Rashid noticed that the alpha horse, the one humans usually assume is the herd leader, was not always the horse the others followed. While the alpha maintained his or her position by intimidation the alpha in a herd, it may surprise you to know, may be a mare, others in the herd tended to stay away from this bully figure. The alpha horse bossed the others around, but they looked elsewhere for true leadership. This horse was chosen by the herd rather than violently imposing leadership on the others. This is the leader chosen by the herd, the one they trust and follow. In this book, Mark Rashid lays out his own method of training in a series of stories, telling of horses and riders and trainers he has known, problems presented, and solutions found. He does not preach new techniques. His method, he acknowledges, may not be for everyone. So I got up early on Tuesday, eager to read further in *Horses Never Lie*, and as I reached the final page and gathered myself together to go out into the world, to stop at the bank and post office and library, to get out into the sunshine so Sarah could have another run before our long bookstore day, I felt happier than I had felt facing the world for many days. After all, there are horses in the world, and there are dogs, and there are good friends and neighbors and strangers and acquaintances who might become friends if we can only stop fighting one another for dominance. So why should our human predicament be hopeless?

Yes, there is a serial killer on the rampage, murdering young women in the Lincolnshire town of Lyndford, but no, the reader is not witness to a long-winded police procedural, which is almost incidental. It is the reader who gathers the clues, pieces together the evidence and finally, tries to guess who the killer is. Told from the perspective of five different people, we are introduced to the different suspects. There is Juliet who, upon seeing a profile of the average serial killer, realizes her abusive husband, Paul, ticks all the boxes. And Tamsin, whose crush on work colleague, Jake, turns to fear and suspicion. Steve suspects his childhood friend, Dan and, finally, Dorothy learns that her son, Orlando, is keeping a secret from her. Chapters juggle between the killings, and the lives of each of these well-rounded and sympathetic characters, as their suspicions unfold and escalate. *The Devil You Know* is a compelling and absorbing read that had me hooked right from the beginning, and guessing right to the end. It also made me think about how well I really know my friends, colleagues and family. *Unyielding* is as equally heart-breaking, informative and packed with suspense, tracing the story of her grandparents, who belonged to the German Resistance, in their battle against the Nazi regime. Through their friends and family, we also learn of the terrible hardships that faced not only the Jews, but most Germans, during WWII. Infused with the love and humour of this most engaging couple, as they honeymoon in Europe, then start a family, and deal with different relatives, the author paints a very realistic view of that terrible era. The suspense of their resistance activities, coupled with the fact that people had to be careful about what they said, and to whom, since comments about the Nazi party often proved fatal, make this a riveting read. In this first story we meet the main characters, following their journeys that brought them together as a married couple. Following the Great War, the country is suffering political unrest and economic ruin, which Hitler promises to rectify. The stage is set for the darkness and tragedy that we know will follow. The prose evokes unrest, fear, trepidation and anticipation for another war. I also knew next to nothing about Maud Gonne and was intrigued to learn how extraordinary she was, and about the hold she had over Yeats. It is and Joycie Todd, a famous model, lives with her photographer boyfriend, Marcus. She seems to have it all. Despite Marcus bolstering her modelling career, and his obvious love for her, Joycie is unable to reciprocate his attentions. Rumour says she ran off with a man, but when Joycie finds a bloodstained rug under the bed, and is haunted by nightmares and snippets of memories from her past, she begins to ask questions. When Joycie reconnects with her aunt, she is propelled to seek the truth about her parents, if she is ever to settle in her present life. The author smoothly switches between the past and the present, as we follow Joycie on her gripping journey towards the truth. I found *Her Turn to Cry* an addictive page-turner, as Joycie develops and eventually blooms into her true self. With incredible suspense, excellently-drawn characters and a thrilling plot, I would highly recommend this to

When Marcy leaves on a world dancing tour, Taylor and Ryan are left to struggle with their growing feelings for each other. I really enjoyed the relationship between Taylor and her friend, Marcy. But is that tie strong enough to weather the love that develops between Ryan and Taylor? As Taylor "uncertain about her future after graduating from college, and stuck working in a bookshop" witnesses the dreams of those around her coming true, she begins to question what she needs to find her own happiness. I would highly recommend this moving tale of loss, true love, real life and friendships. Orphaned during WW1, six-year old Arthur Hobhouse is separated from his sister, Kitty, when he is sent on a horrendous voyage to Australia in , losing not only his birth country and everything he knew, but also his very identity. Throughout his early harsh and cruel years in the Australian outback, Arthur gained solace from his only possession: Despite suffering unspeakable hardships with fellow orphan Marty, Arthur ends up becoming a master-boat builder. This is where the second part of the story begins: Through his lyrical and moving prose, the author evokes a whole array of emotions: Apart from the harrowing issues of the treatment suffered by the orphans, this story also explores the strength of family ties and the need to know who you are, and where you come from, something that was stripped from the children as soon as they set foot on the boat that would take them to Australia. Based on fact, this heart-warming, heart-wrenching story brings history alive, and I would recommend it not only to young readers, but for adults too. Beginning with their carefree childhoods in the prosperous post-war s, through the Vietnam War and hippy years of the 60s, into the mineral boom of the 70s and ending during the corrupt years of the 80s, which saw the birth of WA Inc. There is an environmentalist fighting to save the stunning Pilbara from greedy mining companies, a crippled Vietnam war veteran who finds his talent elsewhere, and the ambitious geologist who joins forces with the shady businessman, both of them having a great impact on the rise and development of Perth from sleepy coastal town to important, booming city. But the s sees the four friends swamped by a floodtide of change, and with their opposing personalities, combined with their life choices, things will never be the same for any of them. I also enjoyed learning about the history of Western Australia. I felt the ending was the only weak point in the story. *Promises to Keep*, where the heroine, Katherine, leaves behind painful memories of her failed marriage in Canada to go to France to begin a new life with her French love, Philippe. *I Promise You* This begins where book 2 ends, with Katherine returning to Canada to help her friend Molly, after a serious accident. And culminates in an unpredictable outcome as the final plot piece slots into place to uncover the hidden treasure. The heroine, Katherine returns to France from her home in Canada to begin a new life with her French love, Philippe. It shows us how our lives can so quickly change and that, if we take the plunge, we are capable of adapting to its new course. Modern childrens literature is classified in two different ways, genre or the age of the reader. Childrens literature can be traced to stories and songs, part of an oral tradition. The development of childrens literature, before printing was invented, is difficult to trace. Even after printing became widespread, many childrens tales were originally created for adults. Since the 15th century, a quantity of literature, often with a moral or religious message, has been aimed specifically at children. The late nineteenth and early centuries became known as the Golden Age of Childrens Literature as this period included the publication of many books acknowledged today as classics. There is no single or widely used definition of childrens literature and it can be broadly defined as anything that children read or more specifically defined as fiction, non-fiction, poetry, or drama intended for and used by children and young people. Rowlings Harry Potter series was written and marketed for young adults, the series extreme popularity led The New York Times to create a separate best-seller list for childrens books. Despite the widespread association of childrens literature with picture books, spoken narratives existed before printing, Seth Lerer, in the opening of *Childrens Literature, A Readers History from Aesop to Harry Potter*, says, This book presents a history of what children have heard and read. The history I write of is a history of reception, early childrens literature consisted of spoken stories, songs, and poems that were used to educate, instruct, and entertain children. It was only in the 18th century, with the development of the concept of childhood, that a genre of childrens literature began to emerge, with its own divisions, expectations. He explains that children were in the past not considered as different from adults and were not given significantly different treatment. Pre-modern childrens literature, therefore, tended to be of a didactic and moralistic nature, with the purpose of conveying conduct-related, educational, during the 17th century, the concept of childhood began to emerge in Europe. Adults saw children as separate beings, innocent and in need of protection, the English philosopher John Locke developed his theory of the tabula rasa in his *An Essay Concerning Human Understanding*. A corollary of this doctrine was that the mind of the child was born blank, and he also suggested that picture books be created for children.

2. Marine biology

Marine biology is the scientific study of organisms in the sea. Marine biology differs from marine ecology as marine ecology is focused on how organisms interact with each other, a large proportion of all life on Earth lives in the ocean. The exact size of this proportion is unknown, since many ocean species are still to be discovered. Marine life is a vast resource, providing food, medicine, at a fundamental level, marine life helps determine the very nature of our planet. Marine organisms contribute significantly to the cycle, and are involved in the regulation of the Earths climate. Shorelines are in part shaped and protected by marine life, many species are economically important to humans, including both finfish and shellfish. It is also becoming understood that the well-being of marine organisms, the human body of knowledge regarding the relationship between life in the sea and important cycles is rapidly growing, with new discoveries being made nearly every day. These cycles include those of matter and of air, large areas beneath the ocean surface still remain effectively unexplored. The study of marine biology dates back to Aristotle, who made observations of life in the sea around Lesbos. In 1773, Samuel Gottlieb Gmelin published the *Historia Fucorum*, the first work dedicated to marine algae and it included elaborate illustrations of seaweed and marine algae on folded leaves. The British naturalist Edward Forbes is generally regarded as the founder of the science of marine biology, the pace of oceanographic and marine biology studies quickly accelerated during the course of the 19th century. The observations made in the first studies of marine biology fueled the age of discovery, during this time, a vast amount of knowledge was gained about the life that exists in the oceans of the world. Many voyages contributed significantly to this pool of knowledge, among the most significant were the voyages of the HMS

Beagle where Charles Darwin came up with his theories of evolution and on the formation of coral reefs. The creation of laboratories was important because it allowed marine biologists to conduct research. The oldest marine laboratory in the world, Station biologique de Roscoff, was established in France in 1872, in the United States, the Scripps Institution of Oceanography dates back to 1908, while the prominent Woods Hole Oceanographic Institute was founded in 1930. As inhabitants of the largest environment on Earth, microbial marine systems drive changes in every global system, microbes are responsible for virtually all the photosynthesis that occurs in the ocean, as well as the cycling of carbon, nitrogen, phosphorus and other nutrients and trace elements. Microscopic life undersea is incredibly diverse and still poorly understood, for example, the role of viruses in marine ecosystems is barely being explored even in the beginning of the 21st century.

3. Bottlenose dolphin

” Bottlenose dolphins, the genus *Tursiops*, are the most common and well-known members of the family Delphinidae, the family of oceanic dolphin. Recent molecular studies show the genus contains two species, the bottlenose dolphin and the Indo-Pacific bottlenose dolphin, instead of one. Research in 2003 revealed a species, the Burrunan dolphin. Bottlenose dolphins inhabit warm and temperate seas worldwide and they live in all oceans except for the Arctic and Antarctic Circle area. Bottlenose dolphins live in groups typically of 10–30 members, called pods and their diets consist mainly of forage fish. Dolphins often work as a team to harvest fish schools, Dolphins search for prey primarily using echolocation, which is similar to sonar. They emit clicking sounds and listen for the echos to determine the location and shape of nearby items. Numerous investigations of bottlenose dolphin intelligence have been conducted, examining mimicry, use of language, object categorization. They can use tools and transmit cultural knowledge across generations, Bottlenose dolphins gained popularity from aquarium shows and television programs such as Flipper. They have also been trained by militaries to locate sea mines or detect. In some areas, they cooperate with local fishermen by driving fish into their nets, some encounters with humans are harmful to the dolphins, people hunt them for food, and dolphins are killed inadvertently as a bycatch of tuna fishing and by getting caught in crab traps. The deepest dive ever recorded for a dolphin was 1000 meters. This was accomplished by Tuffy, a dolphin trained by the US Navy, scientists were long aware that *Tursiops* dolphins might consist of more than one species. Molecular genetics allowed much greater insight into this previously intractable problem, *truncatus* lives in the Black Sea, The Pacific bottlenose dolphin, another subspecies of *T.* The two ecotypes of the bottlenose dolphin within the western North Atlantic are represented by the shallower water or coastal ecotype. Their ranges overlap, but they have shown to be genetically distinct. They are not currently described, however, as species or subspecies. In general, genetic variation between populations is significant, even nearby populations.

4. Choose Your Own Adventure

” Choose Your Own Adventure, as published by Bantam Books, was one of the most popular childrens series during the 1950s and 1960s, selling more than 100 million copies between 1950 and 1980. When Bantam, now owned by Random House, allowed the Choose Your Own Adventure trademark to lapse, the series was relaunched by Chooseco, notably, Chooseco does not reissue titles by Packard, who has started his own imprint, U-Ventures. Originally created for 7- to 12-year-olds, the books are written in the second person, the protagonist—that is, the reader—takes on a role relevant to the adventure, for example, private investigator, mountain climber, race car driver, doctor, or spy. Stories are generally gender and race neutral, though in some cases, particularly in illustrations. The stories are formatted so that, after a couple of pages of reading, the number of endings is not set, and varies from as many as 44 in the early titles, to as few as 8 in later adventures. This allows for a sense of unpredictability, and leads to the possibility of repeat readings. As the series progressed, both Packard and Montgomery experimented with the format, sometimes introducing unexpected twists such as endless page loops or trick endings. Examples include the paradise planet ending in *Inside UFO*, which can only be reached by cheating or turning to the page by accident. According to Packard, the idea for the series emerged from bedtime stories that he told to his daughters, revolving around a character named Pete. Packard stated, I had a character named Pete and I usually had him encountering all these different adventures on an isolated island, but that night I was running out of things for Pete to do, so I just asked what they would do. His two daughters came up with different paths for the story to take and Packard

thought up an ending for each of the paths, what really struck me was the natural enthusiasm they had for the idea. He set out in to find a publisher but was rejected by nine publishing companies, causing him to shelve the idea. In , he was able to convince Ray Montgomery, co-owner of Vermont Crossroads Press, to publish the book and it sold 8, copies, a large amount for a small local publishing house. The series was marketed to Pocket Books, where it also sold well. After some discussion, Montgomery was able to make a contract for the series with Bantam Books, Packard and Montgomery were selected to write books for the series, including the contracting out of titles to additional authors. The series was successful after it began printing with Bantam Books 5. Library of Congress – The Library of Congress is the research library that officially serves the United States Congress and is the de facto national library of the United States. It is the oldest federal cultural institution in the United States, the Library is housed in three buildings on Capitol Hill in Washington, D. The Library of Congress claims to be the largest library in the world and its collections are universal, not limited by subject, format, or national boundary, and include research materials from all parts of the world and in more than languages. Two-thirds of the books it acquires each year are in other than English. The Library of Congress moved to Washington in , after sitting for years in the temporary national capitals of New York. Beckley, who became the first Librarian of Congress, was two dollars per day and was required to also serve as the Clerk of the House of Representatives. The small Congressional Library was housed in the United States Capitol for most of the 19th century until the early s, most of the original collection had been destroyed by the British in , during the War of To restore its collection in , the bought from former president Thomas Jefferson his entire personal collection of 6, books. After a period of growth, another fire struck the Library in its Capitol chambers in , again destroying a large amount of the collection. The Library received the right of transference of all copyrighted works to have two copies deposited of books, maps, illustrations and diagrams printed in the United States. It also began to build its collections of British and other European works and it included several stories built underground of steel and cast iron stacks. Although the Library is open to the public, only high-ranking government officials may check out books, the Library promotes literacy and American literature through projects such as the American Folklife Center, American Memory, Center for the Book, and Poet Laureate. And for fitting up an apartment for containing them. Books were ordered from London and the collection, consisting of books and 3 maps, was housed in the new Capitol, as president, Thomas Jefferson played an important role in establishing the structure of the Library of Congress. The new law also extended to the president and vice president the ability to borrow books and these volumes had been left in the Senate wing of the Capitol. One of the only congressional volumes to have survived was a government account book of receipts and it was taken as a souvenir by a British Commander whose family later returned it to the United States government in The Little Prince is one of the best-selling books ever published.
