You simply need to connect your printer to the computer and drivers are downloaded from software update service automatically. But this sounds like a simple method only when you are connecting your printer though a USB cable. In case you need to connect it through WiFi or wireless network then you need to follow certain steps which may be trickier at times. In this post we will guide you through all the simple methods to connect an Epson Printer to wireless network or WiFi. You will also learn some other ways to connect your Epson Printer wirelessly. Connect an Epson Printer to Wireless Network? Wireless printing could be very useful and convenient. Almost all Epson printers can connect to your modem or Wi-Fi router through a wireless network. Wireless printing allows you to print directly from anywhere at your home no matter which room or floor your computer is located. Your smartphone and other mobile device such as android phone, or iPhone, iPad and iPod can also print directly from anywhere in your home when connected to the same WiFi network. However, in this post we will only be focusing on Wi-Fi enabled Epson printers. Connecting an Epson printer to wireless network In order to print from a new Epson printer, you need to connect the Epson printer to wireless network or Wi-Fi first. And then add the printer to your computer from control panel to start printing. You will not need to download any additional driver from Epson Support website in case you are running Windows 8. The driver software are automatically downloaded through Windows or Apple software update service respectively. You can setup your Epson printer to print from your computer using the wireless access point too. Before connecting the Epson Printer to wireless network: Wireless enabled Epson Printer Computer with a wireless interface Access point or wireless router Internet Connection Ethernet cable used only for wired connection to the wireless router or access point Information required: Connect an Epson Printer to Wireless network. Many Epson printer models allow you to connect to the Wireless network using the inbuilt control panel which usually also have a display menu. To connect your Epson Printer to Wi-Fi 1. Press the home button. You will see the following screen: Do one of the following: Using the up and down arrow key, highlight the Wi-Fi network name you want to connect to and press OK to select. Press the cancel button a circle with a triangle icon to cancel the selection and select a different Wi-Fi network. Enter the Wireless password to connect your Epson printer to the WiFi network 6. Press OK to confirm Wi-Fi settings. You may be asked whether you want to print the network status report. Your Epson Printer should now be connected to the Wireless network. Once you are successfully connected, you may see the SSID and IP address information in the status report that you printed in the previous steps and the WiFi connection symbol is also lit. Repeat the steps from 1 through 7 to try connecting again. Your computer and other wireless device can connect directly to your printer and send the print job. When you enable Wi-Fi Direct mode, your printer shows you a network name and password. You are required to connect to the same network created by the Epson printer, in order to print from it. Before trying to connect to the WiFi, you need the following: Computer with a wireless network interface 3. Once you have enabled it, you can make direct communication between your Printer and computer or other devices without a WiFi router or access point. When you see the following screen: Press the down arrow button and then the OK button to change the password. Enter the new Wi-Fi Direct password. Your password must be between 8 and 22 characters long. When you have finished typing the password, select Done and press the OK button. You see a screen like this: Printer displays the Wireless settings once the WiFi direct is enabled 9. Now connect your computer or any other wireless device to the same WiFi network that your Epson Printer created and showed in the last step. Once you are connected, you can print from the connected device. You simply need to press the WPS button located on your router or access point and then

press the WPS button on your printer. Some router has a physical WPS button often located at the back, but all new access point or wireless router has a software WPS button. In software button, you need to login to the admin console of your wireless router or access point and then push the WPS button to initiate the connection process. Your Epson printer should now be connected to the wireless network. That was all about the different ways to connect your Epson printer to wireless network.

If you never see yourself printing from a phone or a tablet, this feature can be disabled. If you like borderless prints, AirPrint is for you. Since there are no sizing options within AirPrint, any image you send to the printer will fill the paper you have loaded into the printer. While the functionality of AirPrint is limited, the color and contrast of the prints were surprisingly good. Epson Remote Print This is a feature that lets you send images from your smart device to your printer even if you are on the other side of the planet. This would be great for sharing images remotely with friends, relatives, or colleagues back home. Unfortunately, each time I attempted to register the SureColor P using the software provided I got a message that the service was not available. The manual claims the SureColor P is capable of using Epson connect. Your results may vary. Epson iPrint mobile app If you are looking for more control over the printing process from your smart device, this app should do the trick. Epson iPrint lets you print from a variety of sources: Photos and documents on your smart device. The Internet, using a built in browser, complete with print preview Images you have stored in Dropbox, Evernote, Google Drive, etc. A network connected scanner such as those on the Epson Workforce copiers The camera built into your phone or tablet Epson iPrint home screen showing available options In addition the images stored on my iPad, connecting to my Dropbox account using my email address and password gave me access to all the photos I have stored there as well. Once you have chosen which image s you want to print, Epson iPrint gives you lots of options. Pick from 27 print sizes and 11 Epson paper surfaces matte and glossy with or without borders. Once you have chosen your paper size, Epson iPrint lets you pinch down the image to include all of the edges. This may leave uneven borders but none of the image will be cropped away. You can also zoom in allowing you to deliberately crop the image and reposition it within the frame. Epson iPrint image browser window available and printing options The results, again, were surprisingly good. Wi-Fi Direct Setup located at the bottom of the Wi-Fi Setup menu also has a connection wizard that takes care of most of the work. It creates a private ad-hoc network for you, and then displays the name and password. You connect your smart device to this private network as you would any other wireless network. You can expect the same functionality you would have if the printer were on a conventional wireless network. Wrapping it up Would I lay down my hard earned money for this printer? The SureColor P is definitely an improvement over its predecessor, the Stylus Pro , in terms of its general construction, color gamut, and overall design. I love the idea of being able to make a print of any size between 4x6 inches and 17x22 inches. The variety of papers available for this printer is staggering. Confirm the connection and network setup of the PC or other device. Connection using the EpsonNet Setup is available. Contact your network administrator for assistance. Check that the power is on for devices, such as the PC, that want to use the printer. Check that devices that want to use the printer, such as the PC, are on the same network. If you have checked the above points, perform network setup using EpsonNet Setup. If you cannot change the settings using your printer, make settings using EpsonNet Setup. Confirm default gateway setup. Other devices on the network are turned on The network address set manually for the printer is correct The network address for the printer is the same as the one for other devices If you have checked all of the above points, try the following: If your printer is listed in the printer list, set the IP address for the printer on the IP address setup screen. If your printer is not listed, the security key may be incorrect. You can register multiple security keys for the access point in WEP security mode. If multiple keys are registered, check if you have entered the first key registered. In some cases, the error cannot be specified. We recommend performing network setup using EpsonNet Setup. The IP address not only indicates the devices connected to the network such as PC, hub, and router but also the network range they belong to. Devices on the same network can communicate with each other. If you wish to communicate with devices on a different network, a router is required. An IP address consists of two parts. The first part is called the "network address" and indicates the network range. The second part is called the "host address" and indicates the network device. The line between the network address and the host address differs according to the scale class of the network. However you can define the line between the network address and the host address using the subnet mask. Check the IP address for the router or access point connected to your PC. For details, see the instruction manual for the router or access point. All IP addresses are written in segments of four numerical values for IPv4. In the final segment, set a unique numerical value within a range of 1 to IP address for the router or access point: Also, the gateway uses the same value as the IP address for the access point. If you have problems printing or scanning, improve your wireless network environment. Due to low signal strength, printing speed may be slow or printing may be interrupted. Perform the following to improve the environment: Place the printer close to the access point Remove any obstacles between the access point and the printer. Signal interference can be caused by other wireless networks being used in nearby rooms or buildings. Placing the printer close to the access point may improve the environment. Confirm network name SSID. You are connecting to a different access point. Change the SSID for the access point you want to connect to, and then perform network setup for your printer again. Disconnect one of the connected devices if you want to add another one.
