Substitute Records These links will take you to wiki pages describing alternate sources for birth, marriage and death records. Cemetery records are a rich source of birth and death information. These records may also reveal family relationships. Census records are a valuable source for birth and marriage information. You may also determine approximate time of death when the individual disappears from the census. This is a good place to begin a search. Besides obituaries, local newspapers may contain birth and marriage announcements and death notices. Local genealogical and historical societies often publish periodicals which may contain abstracted early birth, marriage and death information. If no death record exists, probate records may be helpful in estimating when an individual died. Often this information is found in county-level records or in last name searches of the FamilySearch Catalog. Tips Information listed on vital records is given by an informant. Learn the relationship of the informant to the subject s of the record. The closer the relationship of the informant to the subject s and whether or not the informant was present at the time of the event can help determine the accuracy of the information found on the record. If you are unable to locate vital records recorded by governments, search for church records of christening, marriage, death or burial. A family Bible may have been used to record births, marriages and deaths. Copies of some vital records recorded in the last years may be unavailable to anyone except a direct relative. Also search using the name of the county to locate records kept by the county.
