Large grants of land were made to Hugh de Gournay in Norfolk and Suffolk , [1] and a younger branch of this ancient family held certain manors in Norfolk in the time of King Henry II. Arriving in Norwich in , he became active in the woollen trade. In he married Elizabeth Swanton died of Woodbridge , by whom he had eight children. He died as a wealthy man in and was buried in "the old Dutch garden that the Friends had bought as their burial ground, the Gildencroft or Buttercup Field ", on the land John Gurney had been given to tend when he first arrived in Norwich. Both brothers married and had numerous children. The Quaker bank became renowned for its honesty, reliability and fair dealings, and so people entrusted the Gurney family with their money for safekeeping. Bartlett Gurney was married twice, but died childless at Coltishall , Norfolk, in He was succeeded in control of the bank by Richard â€™ and John Gurney â€™ , grandsons of Joseph Gurney â€™ Their six children included Anna Gurney , the Old English scholar, and Hudson Gurney â€™ , who later inherited great wealth from his father and acted as the head of the Norwich Gurney family. He remained childless, and his fortune was inherited mostly by John Henry Gurney Sr. They had 13 children, of whom several died young. Another sister was Louisa Hoare , the writer on education. In the 19th century, the Gurney family was known for its wealth: This failure ruined a number of the Gurneys, as well as numerous investors. That establishment recently passed into the hands of new partners, whose resources are beyond all question". He later made his home Northrepps , near Cromer , where he pursued ornithology. His son, John Henry Gurney Jr. Besides managing his banking business, Daniel Gurney served as High Sheriff of Norfolk in and took an interest in archaeology and genealogy. In he printed in two volumes for private circulation an elaborate work entitled *The Record of the House of Gournay*, to which he added a supplement in Keswick Hall accommodated a teacher training college prior to being converted into apartments.

Gourlay an Englishman Ingelramus de Gourlay is the first example of this name recorded in Scotland. Ingelram de Gorney is said to have accompanied William the Lion when the king returned from captivity in England. King William gave him land in Clydesdale and Lothian circa 1174. Sometime after 1174, Hugh witnessed a charter by Ingelram de Balliol of the church of Inverkiler to the Abbey of Arbroath. Hugh de Gourney possessed lands in the Lothians and Fifeshire. Thomas Gurley was an attorney in Perth in 1540. There were Gourlays in Kincaig, Fifeshire, Scotland. They owned this land for over six hundred years Black.
