ArtHearty Staff Roses are one of the favorite flowers. They are the most common flowers on greeting cards. They are also engraved on many various objects. Roses are also embroidered on many fabrics like hand napkins, table clothes, etc. Hence, learning to draw roses can help you not just to draw these flowers better, but also help you to create various crafts. So, without further ado, here are the various steps with pictures that will guide you in drawing roses.

How to Draw a Rose Step 1 The first step is just to draw two oval circles. The shape of these circles, will change depending upon the angle at which the flower is viewed from. These two circles are nothing but just light guidelines for drawing the inner compact bud like structure with petals, and the outer more open petals of the rose.

Step 2 In this step simply at the center of the circle, start drawing mini petals, touching each other.

Step 3 After this add few more petals and draw a bottom half oval, below the petals. This forms the main compact center of the flower, that gives the flower its volume.

Step 4 In this step add some more relaxed and bigger looking petals, near the inside compact part of the rose flower.

Step 5 In this step slowly start adding more petals. Make sure you draw them in proper angle, by observing the rose flower or a picture of rose. See, how the petals should envelope the rose center, and then how the loose ends of the petals should jut out.

Step 6 This is the final stage of drawing. In this step neatly add the last outer petals. Random pattern will help enhance the natural look of the rose flower.

Step 7 Now, start shading. Before you start with shading, you can consider erasing the guidelines with a kneadable eraser. For shading, you can use various medium. Colored pencils, simple brush strokes, pencil, mechanical pens, sketch pens, charcoal, etc. Here a sharp pencil is used. The shading is done from the inside to outside. Sharp and fine lines are used to shade.

Step 8 Now, in this step add finer, lighter and smaller strokes that are from the tip of the petals to the inside. Keep it very light. This will give the round shape feeling of the petals.

Step 9 Above we saw how to draw a rose flower step by step. So, following the above drawing steps draw roses. Now, add stems, and the rose leaves to the drawing. Make sure you add a bit of thorns and draw proper shape of the stem and the leaves, so that they look like a rose stem.

Step 10 Finally, in a similar manner do shading or the stem and the leaves, and your rose drawing is complete. Feel free to try colored pencil techniques while shading or coloring the roses. Adding color will make your drawing look even more beautiful. You can draw such a roses and paint it with some colors. Drawings like this will make a good front page for a greeting card.

Front View Rose Here is a simple front view of a rose. Here is a front view of the rose where, less of the inside and more of the front of the rose is shown.

Watercolor Painted Roses Here are two simple painted roses. To make your drawings look even more attractive, consider painting them. You can use watercolor for a beautiful effect. However, if you are not good with watercolors then try pencil or pastel colors.

Red Color Roses Here is a detailed drawing of two roses. You can notice the details with which the drawings has been done. You can also notice various details on the green leaves in this drawing.

Various Roses Here are multiple roses. These are simple drawings which are painted with watercolors. You can see how the leaves are added to give some depth. ArtHearty Staff Last Updated: Feb 3, Whether depicted realistically or in impressionistic technique, in subdued colors or in full explosion of their natural colors, in bud or full bloom, flowers as a subject in art, both by the artist and the collector, have always had a universal appeal. Whether you travel to the mountains or go to the valleys or plains, they are there. They can be potted flowers or they can be wild flowers. Whatever be the kind of flower, there is no doubt it is going to be beautiful. Flowers come in various shapes sizes and colors, each one is distinctively beautiful. If you are one of those who is inspired by the happy, fresh, and uplifting quality of flowers, and want to learn how to draw them, the following pointers will make will make drawing flowers easier for you. They are a step-by-step guide on how to draw flowers. Keep these in mind while drawing any flower, and you will be surprised to see the hidden artist in you. Insects like bees that pollinate flowers have a special vision. This enables them to see colors and designs that the human eye cannot see. This means that, a flower that looks plain to us can be of a spectacular rainbow of designs and colors to an insect! Choose a simple white paper as the background for the first time, and later opt for other canvas mediums. While it is suggested that beginners use pencils to make a primary sketch, some of you can also use pens, markers, or crayons for the sketches, if you have a good hand at it. Outlines and rough shapes should always be drawn using HB or light pencils. The final outline can be done later once the basic form is complete, with dense and dark lead pencils like 2b or 4b. You can also use a pen to highlight the final result. Keep an eraser handy. However, use it very lightly on the paper. Excess use of an eraser can spoil the paper and the drawing. Observation is the key to capturing the essence of anything you want to draw. Hence, first observe the shapes of flowers in nature. For example, a daisy has a round shape, a tulip an oval shape, while foxgloves have a triangular trumpet-like shape. Then, notice the petals. Next, put a flower, either a real one in a vase, or a photograph in front of you. Then, using an HB or lighter pencil, begin sketching on your sketch pad. Make sure you are drawing lightly, lest if you make a mistake, the page may get shabby when you erase the lines. It is best to start by drawing the overall shape of the flower first. Proceed step by step, which is, first complete the outline and basic shape. At this stage, do not attempt to put in any shading, details, or other characteristic aspects of the flower. The aim at this point is to capture the general shape of the flower. However, this will end up in a misshapen flower, because it is harder to judge and draw overlapping forms and small distances. Now lightly sketch the petals, the stem, and the leaves. In the first attempt, you may not be perfect, but the first few times when one is drawing pictures of flowers, nobody gets it cent percent right. Once you are satisfied with having captured the overall shape of the flower, start adding the details. Begin by penciling in hatch lines to depict the shadowed areas of the flower. Always remember to start with light shading and then progress to shading the darker areas. Balance the dark areas by adding middle tones. Apply a little more pressure with your pencil to create darker lines, in order to give more definition to the petals and leaves. Then start shading individual petals to add interest. Notice that the areas where the light hits the flower are lighter in tone, hence, shade accordingly. Almost immediately, you will find your flower coming to life. Now, continue giving more definition to the flower drawing, by strengthening the lines and the shadows. Further deepen the shadowed areas, and keep sketching the full mid-tone range, adding intricate details to give character to your drawing. Aim for balance and unity. Unleash the artist within you as you give your image feeling and life. When you feel that your flower looks complete, it is time to stop. Then you can either use a pen or a felt-tip marker to darken the outlines of the flower. After which, erase the pencil marks outside the darkened lines, and erase any unnecessary lines too. If you want to color the flower in a different way, you can use colors for the shading. Simply complete the outlines with a light pencil, erase the extra and

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rough shapes, and begin coloring. Start by giving a base color to the light tones. Then start adding the mid tones to the flower. Once finished, take a darker shade and color the flower, to give depth by adding dark tones. It may not look so easy in the beginning, however, with regular practice and a few tips, drawing flowers can be fun! Use graphite pencil shading and charcoal pencil to give an artistic statement to the flowers. If you want a realistic and vibrant look, opt for other colorful mediums like water colors, poster colors, or even crayons. When you look for flowers to draw, choose the ones that have interesting patterns of petals, such as dahlias, hollyhocks, hibiscus, roses, orchids, lilies, tulips, and so on. Small and delicate flowers like violets and honeysuckle also make great subjects for drawing.
