

Chapter 1 : «The Upper Engadine» - Hotel Fex

In the Upper Engadine, as a result of the strong influx of people related to tourism, mainly from outside of Switzerland (mainly from Italy, Austria, Germany), the number of (Swiss) German and Italian speakers outnumber Romansh speakers, and in the heavily touristed village of St. Moritz there are few Romansh speakers to be found.

There, I said it. Because who can resist the emerald lakes, mountain peaks, pine forest and generally rough nature? With hiking boots and rucksacks strapped on, we recently returned to this remote part of Switzerland in order to witness a special natural phenomenon: Thanks to an October heatwave, the needles of the lark trees turn golden before they fall in November. Indian summer in the Upper Engadine occurs every year, but it is usually difficult to pinpoint. This time around, we happened to be there during the peak! Indeed, the conditions for our Indian summer weekend could not have been better: Golden lark trees, green pines and clear blue skies! On the first day, we take the cable car behind our hotel to the top. After a short hike, there is a connecting cable car to Piz Nair at the very top. After a lunch break at meters above sea, we take the cable car back to the middle station. From there, we hike all the way down to Celerina while soaking in the warm afternoon sun. The golden lark trees are simply magnificent And look at this amazing reflection in Lake St. Back in Celerina, this Roman church is set against the backdrop of the colorful autumn forest. On the second day, we hike from the nearby Pontresina train station into the Roseg Valley. This hike was recommended to us by several friends, and now we know the reason why: It is stunning from the moment you enter the forest. I love the Roseg Valley hike particularly because it is a feast for all senses: The pinewoods emit their scent, the Rosegbach river is gushing with fresh water, and the snowy surface of the Roseg glacier is glooming in the distance. About two hours into the hike, we get closer to the Roseg glacier. There, the valley widens and we are rewarded with a majestic view: The best hotel to see all the Indian summer action? Try Hotel Cresta Palace in Celerina. Located in the charming town of Celerina, the four-star Hotel Cresta Palace has a lot going for it. For one, it is within two minutes from the train station and has its own bus stop. This makes exploring all parts of the Upper Engadine extremely efficient. You could hop on the bus towards St. Moritz 9 min , Punt Muragl 4 min or Pontresina 11 min , each of which offers an abundance of hiking trails. As part of at least a two-night stay at the Cresta Palace, you will receive a pass for unlimited use of public transportation in the Upper Engadine. This includes before-mentioned buses, plus the iconic red trains of the Bernina Express, cable cars and chair lifts. The in-house activity manager will help you plan the perfect hikes. In addition, they will be able to organize mountain bikes or golfing sessions.

The Engadin or Engadine Romansh: It follows the route of the Inn Romansh: En from its headwaters at Maloja Pass in the southwest running roughly northeast until the Inn flows into Austria, one hundred kilometers downstream. The Engadine is protected by high mountain ranges on all sides and is famous for its sunny climate, beautiful landscapes and outdoor activities. It is reachable from northern Italy by the Maloja Pass to the west and the Bernina Pass to the south.

Via the Pass dal Fuorn German: The highest mountains of the wider area of the Engadine is the Bernina Range in the southwestern part. The Engadine is traditionally divided into two parts: The Upper Engadine, from Maloja Pass to Zernez, in the west, where the valley stays fairly flat and is remarkably wide up to 1. Its major center is St. Moritz and very bustling during touristic peak seasons, winter and summer.

Moritz lies the village of Samedan, which is the capital of the Upper Engadine. Near Samedan, the river Flaz joins the Inn from the south and the valley opens into a wide meadow framed with mountains. Here, on the flat between those two rivers one also finds the Engadin Airport. Further down from Samedan to the northeast are a number of villages lying on the banks of the Inn. These houses are large and are traditionally shared by two or more families, and they may have what used to be a stable or livestock area underneath. In a typical Engadine village, there are numerous fountains, free-flowing all year round, which were formerly used for drinking water, washing, and for watering livestock. In the summer, the Albula Pass is also open for car travel. The Julier Pass, north above St. Immediately next to northeast of Zuoz is the village of S-chanf, which is the end of the large flat meadows next to the Inn. Below S-chanf the landscape suddenly changes. The Inn, now rather wild, flows through a deep gorge with steep walls and meadows give way to larch woods. At Zernez, the Inn valley opens up again for a short distance. Here the villages are no longer located on the valley floor, but higher up on sunny terraces formed during glacial periods. And further via Landquart to Chur or Zurich. At the very end of the Engadine, a curvaceous mountain road through the deep gorge-like Val da Tschera, not build before, connects to the remote, very secluded and duty-free ski resort Samnaun, which shares a huge ski area with Austrian Ischgl. Samnaun, as well as all larger and even most smaller villages in the main valley or its side valleys, is connected by regular PostBus Switzerland services with RhB stations either in Scuol or any other stop further up the main valley. Here you meet the main railway line between Zurich – Innsbruck – Salzburg – Vienna.
