Key Dates Tuesday May 1, First day for candidates to file a nomination paper for the office of mayor, councillor or school board trustee. First day for an individual or entity to file a notice of registration as a third party advertiser. Preliminary expense limit and other legislative documentation is provided to a candidate on the day they file, or to a registered third party advertiser following certification. Friday July 27, Last day for a candidate to file a nomination. Monday July 30, Certification of nomination papers to be completed by 4 p. Declaration of acclamation provided after 4 p. After the certification of the candidates, Proxy appointment forms available for electors who can not vote on any of the voting days. Tuesday September 25, Final expense limits provided to candidates and third party advertisers. Friday October 19, Last day for an individual or entity to file a notice of registration as a third party advertiser. Monday October 22, Voting day, 10 a. Monday December 31, Campaign period ends for candidates and registered third parties. Last day for candidate or registered third parties to file an Extension of campaign period. Wednesday February 27, Last day for Clerk to provide notice of financial filing requirements and penalties to candidates and registered third parties. Thursday March 28, Last day for candidate or registered third party to apply to Superior Court of Justice to extend the time to file the financial statement. Friday March 29, By 2 p. Last day to file a primary financial statement for reporting period ending December 31, "â€" applies to all candidates and third party advertisers. Last day for candidate or registered third party to notify Clerk of filing extension received from the Superior Court of Justice. Monday April 29, Last day by 2 p. Penalties take affect at 2: Thursday June 27, Last day to request a compliance audit on a primary financial statement. Tuesday July 2, Last day to request a compliance audit on a primary financial statement. End of supplementary campaign period. Wednesday August 28, Last day for Clerk to provide notice of supplementary filing requirements and penalties to candidates or registered third parties. Thursday September 26, Last day for candidate or registered third party to apply to Superior Court of Justice to extend the time to file the financial statement. Friday September 27, By 2 p. Last day to file a supplementary financial statement for reporting period ending July 2, "â€" only applied to those who filed a Form 6 to extend the campaign period. Monday October 28, Last day by 2 p. Friday December 27, Last day to request a compliance audit on a supplementary financial statement. Candidates in Default Below is a list of candidates who are in default of the Municipal Elections Act, because they did not file their financial statement or exceeded the expense limit in the municipal election or subsequent by-elections. The Municipal Elections Act, states those who are in default cannot run until after the next general election has taken place.

*Voter Notification Cards will be sent to the electors in Norfolk County, advising of the dates, times and locations of voting opportunities. The dates, times, and locations for voting opportunities are listed below.*

Remember to bring one piece of ID showing your name and qualifying Norfolk County address. Cancelled personalized cheque, credit card or bank account statement. Cheque stub, T4 statement or pay receipt issued by an employer. Mortgage statement, lease or rental agreement. Transcript or report card from a post-secondary school. Insurance policy or insurance statement. Loan agreement or other financial agreement with a financial institution. Document showing residence at a long-term care home under the Long-Term Care Homes Act, , issued by the Administrator for the home. Hospital card or record. During this time, electors can visit the County Administration Building and correct their personal information i. OR electors may add themselves to the List if they are currently not registered as Norfolk County electors. Even if you had updated your information with Elections Ontario for the Provincial Election that took place on June 7, , you must also update your information with Norfolk County. Please note that no revisions or additions can occur online or over the phone with County representatives – all changes must be made in person at the County Administration Building. If you are unsure if you are registered to vote in Norfolk County please call, Accommodations for Voters Accommodations for voters includes: Appointing a Proxy for electors who will be away, assistance in the voting place and other important accessibility information. Proxy Voting If for any reason you will be unable to cast your ballot in person on Voting Day or at an advance poll, proxy voting allows you to appoint another person to vote on your behalf. A voting proxy is someone who is also an eligible elector in Norfolk County. Immediate family members are your spouse, sibling, parent, child, grandparent and grandchild. The deadline for certification of these forms is 4: A person acting as executor or trustee or in any other representative capacity is still required to obtain a proxy certificate. Curbside Voting If you are physically unable to go inside the voting place, you can request to have your ballot brought to your vehicle, outside of the building or to another area within the voting place. A friend or support person will need to go inside the voting place to let the election officials know that you require curbside voting. Personal Assistance to Voters All election officials are required to take mandatory customer service training and each is provided with the Accessible Customer Service Etiquette Guide. Election officials are also trained to interact with people with disabilities who are accompanied by either a support person or a service animal. If you require assistance, inside the voting place you may bring a friend along or ask an election official for assistance. Your friend may go behind the voting screen with you however they must first state an oral declaration and may only act as a friend once, except in nursing homes, or for family members. Accessible Voting Equipment Accessible voting technology will be available during the advance polling and on election day. The buttons on the ATI are described in both colour and shape in the audio instructions and are also printed in braille. The ATI is the quickest and easiest device for voters who can push buttons firmly. Voters control all ballot movement and selections with a sip inhale or a puff exhale when instructed on the audio track. Paddle Buttons are ideal for voters who may have difficulty pushing buttons on the ATI. Taking Time off to Vote You are entitled to have three hours in which to vote on voting day. If your job requires you to work hours that would not give you a three hour period in which to vote, you are allowed to be absent from your job for enough time to give you that three hour period. This does not mean that you are entitled to take three hours off of work. Voting hours on election day are from 10 a.
