

Chapter 1 : In Confidence: Holocaust History Told By Those Who Lived It

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In a rare moment of quiet, a young woman records in her diary her impressions of life in the ghetto. A photo album painstakingly assembled across years reveals the complexity of pre-War life and suggests the enormous losses to come. A little girl suffering illness, confined to a hospital writes a letter begging her mother to come to the window so she can see her. Decades after he loses his own parents, a survivor strengthens his family bonds by sharing his story with his great-grandson and all of us. Walk-up slots are allotted each day, available on a first-come, first-served basis. An advance reservation fee is required for The Last Goodbye. Museum admission is always free for members. They are bringing barrels of food to the living quarters, where it will be distributed. They sell expropriated goods. Sometimes the Jewish people confined to Terezin are able to purchase back their own belongings. People walk past the Hamburg barracks to the train that will deliver them to Auschwitz. Others witness their deportation and say goodbye. In the years he was in Terezin, Peter created 70 drawings in ink and watercolor depicting the camp, the Jewish people who were forced to live there, and the difficult conditions that they endured. When Peter learned that he would be deported to Auschwitz in 1944, he entrusted his portfolio to his mother. When his mother and sister were then deported, the portfolio passed to a family friend. Peter Loewenstein perished in Auschwitz. Regina Cajgfinger and her sister Bronia fled Nazi persecution on a Kindertransport bound for England. There they reunited with their mother. Their father, who remained behind in Danzig, was murdered by the Nazis. They were liberated in 1945. On the back of this drawing she made in Terezin, Zuzana wrote: Dear Mommy, I wish you all the best and hope that next year for your birthday we will be together in Prague. Lots of luck and health wishes your Zuzka. Her autograph book and other items appear in this exhibition. This book of photographs mounted on 44 pages shows the members and activities of Zionist youth group Ha-Noar Ha-Zioni in Poland. It documents scenes in Bielsko, on outings, at summer camps, celebrating Jewish holidays, and receiving visits from members of the Warsaw branch of the organization. It also includes evidence of troubling times a photo of a Jewish school, windows broken, after a pogrom. Maryla wrote and preserved her diary through her time in the Vilna Ghetto, Kaiserwald concentration camp, Stutthof concentration camp, on a death march, and after liberation. Handwritten Yiddish text translates:

in confidence, as a secret or private matter, not to be divulged or communicated to others; with belief in a person's sense of discretion: I told him in confidence.

There were many tears and well wishes, but the church understood that it was time for Rick to move forward. During the service, Jason, along with several others, shared how Rick had affected each of their lives for the better. Fast forward about a month later, and Jason was shocked when he received an email from Rick expressing disappointment with what Jason had shared. Although what Jason shared was true, Rick felt that some may have perceived the real reason for his departure from the church to be marital problems, which was far from the truth. In his email, Rick went on to say that because they were close, he knew that Jason was just sharing from his heart with the best of intentions. However, Rick also wanted to use this as a lesson for Jason to learn how careful he must be when speaking from the pulpit. While that was not the case here, Rick wanted Jason to know that he might not be so lucky next time and that any other individual could attempt to hold Jason and the church liable for defamation. Although the story above is fictional, it serves as a good reminder of just how easy our words can be misconstrued, especially by those who may not fully understand our hearts and intent. In fact, many courts across the country have determined that ministers may be responsible for making defamatory remarks if a civil court can resolve the dispute without having to examine church doctrine or polity. As a minister of the gospel, you are held to a higher standard of integrity. As one who speaks from the pulpit each week, your words hold a sense of authority and power.
