It is best to recognize that in those contexts military leaders and civilian managers will have diverse and potentially contradictory views about what organizations are and how they can be changed. Many of us are barely aware of our own theories much less those held by our counterparts who lead other organizations in an interagency or joint context. Stavridis shares vivid moments from recent military history to explain why security of the future should be built with bridges rather than walls. A reason for this is their apparent lack of knowledge and understanding of the relationship between theory and practice and the real purpose of military theory.
