How can a rural EMS agency find funding to purchase major equipment, such as an ambulance? Multiple programs can assist rural EMS agencies with purchasing or obtaining major equipment: In the past, grants have been used to purchase equipment, protective gear, emergency vehicles, training, and other resources necessary to protect emergency personnel. Applications for this opportunity are accepted on an ongoing basis. How are rural EMS agencies funded? Rural EMS services often travel longer distances per run due to the larger service areas and lower population density in rural areas, which result in higher average costs per trip for the agency as compared to their urban counterparts that can spread costs over more trips. Reports from the Field , most rural EMS agencies rely on a variety of funding strategies to provide response services in their communities. Sources of funding and resources can include: There are many continuing education programs available for EMS personnel. Many rural EMS agencies have internal training officers that coordinate local trainings and use resources from area hospitals, larger ambulance agencies, air ambulance agencies, and area colleges. Online continuing education is available from a variety of internet resources. Some state EMS associations conduct conferences that contain continuing education content. For local or state opportunities near you, contact your state EMS agency and ask to speak with someone about continuing education. Other opportunities for continuing education programs include: NAEMT also has a course locator for the courses they provide in clinical, leadership, safety, and tactical topics. Where can I find a list of state EMS contacts? Why should a rural hospital be part of a regional and statewide trauma system? According to the American Trauma Society, trauma system is defined as: Rural hospitals should be part of regional and statewide trauma systems to provide appropriate, collaborative care for their patients. A Surgery article, Rural Risk: Geographic Disparities in Trauma Mortality , found that rural residents are more likely to die from a trauma related injury than non-rural residents. This is not a new finding; Safety in Numbers: Being part of a trauma system allows rural facilities to respond and treat patients at the local level. Many states have a trauma program manager who may be employed by the state EMS office, state office of rural health, or at a freestanding program. For more information on your state or regional trauma systems, contact your state EMS agency. How can local EMS agencies be integrated into the local and regional trauma system? Hospitals play a role in engaging the EMS agencies that transport patients to their hospital in discussion, education, and training on trauma care. The medical director for an EMS agency can be affiliated with the local hospital. This situation would provide a natural bridge between the hospital and EMS agency to coordinate, identify, and implement policies and procedures, for example, triage protocols, trauma team activation, or quality improvement and quality assurance reviews. It can be helpful for communities to engage in a specific community planning process that sets out to use existing EMS resources at the community level. A planning process and associated materials are found in Community-Based Needs Assessment: Yes, there are a couple of rural specific programs that provide this type of training:

Volunteers[edit] In some remote areas, Ambulance Victoria oversees volunteer "Community Emergency Response Teams" CERTs to deliver first aid before professional paramedics can attend to an emergency victim. John Ambulance Association was set up with the aim of teaching home nursing and first aid to as many people as possible. It housed one horse drawn ambulance and was bought with money raised by the Association of Ladies of St John. There are also operational support and management staff. Almost 4 million residents lived in this area. These units are run with two paramedics. The MICA units were typically staffed with one specially trained paramedic which includes advanced life support ALS , who are used in cases where extensive patient care is required in addition to a regular unit. A partnership existed between the MAS and the Victorian Fire and Emergency Services Board, where firefighters are dispatched to time-critical medical emergencies where their response time may be quicker than that of the closest MAS unit. The primary example of this is cardiac arrest patients, which has led to fire trucks being equipped with defibrillators and the firefighters being trained advanced CPR and defibrillation. John Ambulance was the founding ambulance service in the state of Victoria. John also provides first aid services at major events across the state and at times interstate. First aid services are provided primarily via a volunteer workforce however there are also paid staff. John also provides first aid services during natural disasters across the state and less often, interstate. Life Saving Victoria[edit] Life Saving Victoria offers volunteer aquatic rescue and first aid services in many coastal areas, and in Mildura. While they do transport patients from the water to land, they do not transport patients to hospitals once landed. Chevra Hatzolah[edit] Hatzolah responders are trained by Ambulance Victoria and are equipped with oxygen and semi automatic defibrillators. Hatzolah responders are trained and equipped to deal with any medical emergency and regularly attend cases such as chest pain, bleeding, full arrest, household accidents, asthma and road trauma. Hatzolah responders are on stand-by 24 hours a day, days a year. Australian Volunteer Coast Guard[edit] The Australian Volunteer Coast Guard provides a maritime search and rescue service, and answers distress calls made by vessels off the Victorian coast. This can involve the transportation of emergency patients. These involve members being trained to respond to cases of suspected cardiac arrest, providing CPR, oxygen and defibrillation services before an Ambulance can arrive.
